in Canada today there is a clear move toward a more outcomes based education system this report examines the state of high school student assessment and reviews standards and accountability strategies it reports on the policies programs and initiatives in all provincial ministries or departments of education and a sample of school boards across the country data were derived from a telephone survey of departmental ministerial representatives from all 10 provinces and the 2 territories and from a questionnaire that was mailed to 279 school boards a total of 140 boards responded a 50 percent response rate data show that both boards and ministries are putting more emphasis on the development of comprehensive policies to cover all aspects of student evaluation there is some movement away from relying on paper and pencil testing as the sole means of evaluation the use of more authentic performance based approaches and a greater variety of assessment techniques are being promoted some of the best practices in high school evaluation involve use of a broad range of assessment methods introduction of or improvements to provincial examinations greater use of summative and formative evaluations greater emphasis on modifying evaluation for special needs students use of performance based assessment and more reporting to parents and the public thirteen tables are included appendices contain copies of the two questionnaires and selected school board material contains 19 references lmi

this book offers a meso level description of demographics science education and science teacher education representing all 13 Canadian jurisdictions the book provides local insights that serve as the basis for exploring the Canadian system as a whole and function as a common starting point from which to identify causal relationships that may be associated with Canada's successes the book highlights commonalities consistencies and distinctions across the provinces and territories in a thematic analysis of the 13 jurisdiction specific chapters although the analysis indicates a network of policy and practice issues warranting further consideration the diverse nature of Canadian science education makes simple identification of causal relationships elusive Canada has a reputation for strong science achievement however there is currently limited literature on science education in Canada at the general level or in specific areas such as Canadian science curriculum or science teacher education this book fills that gap by

presenting a thorough description of science education at the provincial territorial level as well as a more holistic description of pressing issues for canadian science education

this book focuses on central issues that are key components of successful planning development and implementation of Isas the book s main distinction is its focus on practice based cutting edge research this is achieved by having chapters co authored by world class researchers in collaboration with measurement practitioners

this book brings attention to the understudied and often overlooked question of how curricula and classroom practices might inadvertently reproduce exclusionary discourses and narratives that omit or negate particular cultures histories and wisdom traditions with a focus on representations and classroom practices related especially to ancient and indigenous wisdom traditions and cultures it includes unique contributions from scholars studying these questions in various contexts the book offers a range of important studies from various contexts across the americas including canada the various member nations of the caribbean community caricom puerto rico and the united states the various chapter contributions address and discuss nuances of each of the contexts under study the contributions also help highlight some key commonalities across these contexts including how dominant discourses and various forces have historically shaped and continue to shape and reproduce such omissions misrepresentations and marginalization in addition to seeking to reconcile with some of these ancient and indigenous wisdom traditions and cultures the book charts a path forward toward more holistic analytical frameworks as well as more inclusive and balanced representations and classroom practices in these aforementioned geographic contexts and beyond it will appeal to scholars researchers undergraduate and graduate students with interests in indigenous education curriculum studies citizenship education history of education religion and educational policy

is essential to function in our society what must be done to reform schools canadian parents business leaders citizens community and political leaders are asking these and similar questions they know that education is essential for their children and they realize that our country's future depends on a population of educated citizens this book is bill mckerlich's response to these questions twelve steps to reform canadian public education outlines both a comprehensive assessment and a thoughtful plan for the necessary reform of our schools written by an experienced educator focus to adjust the focal length of the eye to give a clear image our school system may have been adequate for the past but is now out of focus with the present learning needs of our students the system requires immediate adjustment so that it has a clear image of purpose and how to achieve this purpose as part of this process it will be necessary to improve the early childhood development of an important minority of our children using our democratic processes these adjustments will be discussed and changes decided the results will be immediately planned and implemented if this does not happen effective public schooling for all children and youth will be lost and a significant minority of canadian children will not reach their potential to be happy and productive citizens the resulting long term negative social and economic consequences will cripple our society book purpose the purpose of this book is to assist this important public discussion by outlining a plan of school reform in twelve steps the plan describes how the early childhood development of some deprived children can improve and how the school system can be refocused so that all children will learn to the maximum of their ability book organisation the steps are stated at the beginning of the chapters in which they are described the first five chapters centre on children learning teaching and schools the later four chapters describe the organisation governance leadership and management processes required for schools to have all children learn the twelve steps form a planned approach to improving schools with the steps often interdependent on each other this approach is in contrast to the unsatisfactory ad hoc tinkering that public education has experienced over the years the plan has direct relevance to the canadian provinces but may have some application to the education jurisdictions of other countries visit the author's website at reformeducation.com
