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fugitives occupy a unique place in the american criminal justice system they can run and they can hide but eventually each chase ends and in many cases history is made along the way john dillinger s capture obsessed j edgar hoover and helped create the modern fbi violent student radicals who went on the lam in the 1960s reflected the turbulence of the era the sixteen year disappearance and sudden arrest of gangster james whitey bulger in 2011 captivated the nation fugitives have become iconic characters in american culture even as they have threatened public safety and the smooth operation of the justice system they are always on the run always trying to stay out of reach of the long arm of the law also prominent are the men and women who chase fugitives fbi agents federal marshals and their deputies police officers and bounty hunters a significant element of the justice system is dedicated to finding those on the run and the most

wanted posters and true crime television shows have made fugitives seemingly ubiquitous figures of fear and fascination for the public in on the lam jerry clark and ed palattella trace the history of fugitives in the united states by looking at the characters real and fictional who have played the roles of the hunter and the hunted they also examine the origins of the bail system and other legal tools such as most wanted programs that are designed to guard against flight

in the 1970s news broke that former nazis had escaped prosecution and were living the good life in the united states outrage swept the nation and the public outcry put extreme pressure on the u s government to investigate these claims and to deport offenders the subsequent creation of the office of special investigations marked the official beginning of nazi hunting in the united states but it was far from the end thirty years later in november 2010 the new york times obtained a copy of a confidential 2006 report by the justice department titled the office of special investigations striving for accountability in the aftermath of the holocaust the six hundred page report held shocking secrets regarding the government s botched attempts to hunt down and prosecute nazis in the united states and its willingness to harbor and even employ these criminals after world war ii drawing from this report as well as other sources spies lies and citizenship exposes scandalous new information about infamous nazi perpetrators including andrija artuković klaus barbie and arthur rudolph who were sheltered and protected in the united states and beyond and the ongoing attempts to bring the remaining nazis such as josef mengele to justice

sometimes a new life is not all it s cracked up to be especially an exciting new identity in government witness relocation for a couple of newlyweds who barely know each other or themselves anymore just ask disgruntled arizona relocation subjects lorenzo and dr lucretia valentino formerly of beautiful beach city indiana much like the merciless sonoran desert things can get a little heated it can also be kind of a drag stuck in the middle of it or more precisely a dreary nowhere ville cul de sac apparently home more to the dead than the living throw into the mix a suspiciously paternal shrink and a sleazy serial killer from their permanently sealed past an outlaw biker kingpin a mysteriously absentee case manager a precocious pair of newborn twins the meddling long distance in laws a cranky lady doc who despises the new government job not working with her beloved cadavers a hopelessly haunted so called safe house and the nightmarish fugitive fun is just beginning
