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encyclopedia of deserts represents a milestone it is the first comprehensive reference to the first comprehensive reference to deserts and semideserts of the world approximately seven hundred entries treat subjects ranging from desert survival to the way deserts are formed topics include biology birds mammals reptiles amphibians fishes invertebrates plants bacteria physiology evolution geography climatology geology hydrology anthropology and history the thirty seven contributors including volume editor michael a mares have had extensive careers in deserts research encompassing all of the world s arid and semiarid regions the encyclopedia opens with a subject list by topic an organizational guide that helps the reader grasp interrelationships and complexities in desert systems each entry concludes with cross references to other entries in the volume inviting the reader to embark on a personal expedition into fascinating previously unknown terrain in addition a list of important readings facilitates in depth study of each topic an exhaustive index permits quick access to places topics and taxonomic listings of all plants and animals discussed more than one hundred photographs drawings and maps enhance our appreciation of the remarkable life landforms history and challenges of the world s arid land

civic and democratic action carmen sirianni shows how various kinds of civic associations and grassroots mobilizing figure in this story especially as they began to explicitly link conservation to the future of our democracy and then develop sustainable cities as a democratic project these organizations are national local or multitiered from the league of women voters to the natural resources defense council to bicycle and watershed associations some challenge city government agencies contentiously while others seek collaboration many do both at some point sirianni uses a range of analytic approaches from scholarly disciplines policy design urban governance social movements democratic theory public administration and planning to understand how such diverse civic and professional associations have come to be both an ecology of organizations and a systemic and coherent project the institutional field of sustainable cities has emerged with some core democratic norms and civic practices but also with many tensions and trade offs that must be crafted and revised strategically in the face of new opportunities and persistent shortfalls sirianni s account draws ambitious yet pragmatic and hopeful lessons for a civic green new deal a policy design for building sustainable and resilient cities on much more robust foundations in the decades ahead while also addressing democratic deficits in our polarized political culture

this book describes the existential threats facing the global water systems from population growth and economic development unsustainable use environmental change and weak and fragmented governance it argues that business as usual water science and management cannot solve global water problems because today s water systems are increasingly complex and face uncertain future conditions instead a more holistic strategic agile and publically engaged process of water decision making is needed building resilience for uncertain water futures emphasises the importance of adaptation through a series of case studies of cities regions and communities that have experimented with anticipatory policy making scenario development and public engagement by shifting perspective from an emphasis on management to one of adaptation the book emphasizes the capacity to manage uncertainties the need for cross sector coordination and mechanisms for engaging stakeholder with differing goals and conflict resolution this book will be a useful resource for students and academics seeking a better understanding of sustainable water use water policy and water resources management

aquatic habitats supply a wide range of vital ecosystem benefits to cities and their inhabitants the unsustainable use of aquatic habitats including inadequate urban water management itself however tends to alter and reduce their biodiversity and therewith diminish their ability to provide clean water protect us from waterborne diseases and pollutants keep urban areas safe from flooding and support recreational ecosystem services and even the aesthetic enjoyment of our world aquatic habitats in sustainable urban water management the result of collaboration between unesco s international hydrological programme and its man and the biosphere programme aims at improving our understanding of aquatic habitats related ecosystem goods and services and conservation and sustainable use with a special focus on their integration into urban water management the first part of this volume reviews basic concepts and challenges in urban aquatic habitats as well as strategies for their management integration the second part examines technical measures related to habitats management and rehabilitation along with their incorporation into urban planning and their role in human health the final part looks at current urban aquatic habitat issues and practical approaches to solving them through the lens of case studies from around the globe urban water series unesco ihp following from the sixth phase of unesco s international hydrological programme 2002 2007 the urban water series unesco ihp addresses fundamental issues related to the role of water in cities and the effects of urbanization on the hydrological cycle and water resources focusing on the development of integrated approaches to sustainable urban water management the series should inform the work of urban water management practitioners policy makers and educators throughout the world

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this book was stimulated by and sets out to analyse a political battle over water pricing by a municipal system originally published in 1984 this title provides improved methods for demand function estimation where block rates are involved suggests procedures for rational pricing of municipal water and explains how politics can dominate when real decisions are made due to the additional virtue of this title being easy to read it is ideal for students interested in environmental studies economics and policy making as well as for those involved with municipal services and resource management in general

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an epic struggle over land water and power is erupting in the american west and the halls of washington dc it began when a 4 000 square mile area of arizona desert called black mesa was divided between the hopi and navajo tribes to the outside world it was a land struggle between two fractious indian tribes to political insiders and energy corporations it was a divide and conquer play for the 21 billion tons of coal beneath black mesa today that coal powers cheap electricity for los angeles a new water aqueduct into phoenix and the neon dazzle of las vegas journalist and historian judith nies has been tracking this story for nearly four decades she follows the money and tells us the true story of wealth and water mendacity and corruption at the highest levels of business and government amid the backdrop of the breathtaking desert landscape unreal city shows five cultures colliding hopi navajo global energy corporations mormons and us government agencies resulting in a battle over resources and the future of the west las vegas may attract 39 million visitors a year but the tourists mesmerized by the dancing water fountains at the bellagio don t ask where the water comes from they don t see a city with the nation s highest rates of foreclosure unemployment and suicide they don t see the astonishing drop in the water level of lake mead where sin city gets 90 percent of its water supply nies shows how the struggle over black mesa lands is an example of a global phenomenon in which giant transnational corporations have the power to separate indigenous people from their energy rich lands with the help of host governments unreal city explores how and why resources have been taken from native lands what it means in an era of climate change and why in this city divorced from nature the only thing more powerful than money is water

how a largely latino a workforce of immigration agents reconciles the moral ambiguities of its work immigration agents have a frontline view of the racial economic and legal inequalities that undocumented migration reflects and yet most agents do not think of the role their jobs play in those inequalities instead they consider themselves law enforcers trained to confine their work strictly to crime control and security in bordering on indifference irene vega offers an original detailed analysis of the rationales that shape how u s immigration agents understand and carry out their professional responsibilities drawing on interviews with ninety immigration agents border patrol agents and ice deportation officers most of whom are mexican americans from the region around the border vega examines why they took the job and how their training and socialization shape the ways that they grapple with the racial and moral issues raised by their work vega shows that indifference is the bureaucratic resource that allows agents to look away from the most morally ambiguous aspects of their work and helps them cultivate legitimacy for their employer she traces the development of the agents moral economy the configuration of norms values and sensibilities that undergirds how they perform their work she also shows how the immigration system benefits from minoritized bureaucrats labor with bordering on indifference vega opens the closed doors of nondescript government buildings and goes into remote areas of the southwestern borderlands to uncover the hidden normative world that immigration enforcement agents inhabit

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
