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while teachers cannot travel back in time to visit their students at earlier ages they can draw on the rich sets of experiences and knowledge that students bring to classrooms in her latest book catherine compton lilly examines the literacy practices and school trajectories of eight middle school students and their families through a unique longitudinal lens the author has studied these same students from first grade we see how students from a low income inner city community grow and develop academically revealing critical insights for teachers about literacy development identity construction and school achievement based on interviews reading assessments and writing samples reading timeadvocates for educators to provide opportunities for students to develop long term relationships with teachers and administrators allow children and parents to share their stories to identify obstacles that students encounter as they move through school collaborate and learn from students former teachers as well as inform their future teachers develop portfolio systems and longitudinal records that highlight children s emerging interests abilities and potential for the future catherine compton lillyis an associate professor in curriculum and instruction at the university of wisconsin madison she has taught in the public school system for 18 years her books includereading families re reading families andbedtime stories and book reports the analysis here runs deeper than other contemporary critiques of accountability regimes and standardization inviting us instead to consider how time schooling and literacy have always been co constructed reading timefeatures compelling examples of literacy practices that traverse generations which could only be understood through interviews and observations extending over time kevin leander vanderbilt university

this book consists of interviews with five distinguished international lawyers from the uk usa uruguay and france conducted by the editor antonio cassese between 1993 and 1995 each interview is preceded by a brief intellectual portrait of the interviewee in his general introduction cassese stresses that the interviews all based on the same questionnaire were intended to bring out not only the main ideas associated with each scholar in the fields of international law and international relations but also his intellectual and philosophical background his general outlook and his views of the prospects for the evolution of the international community in his final essay cassese brings together the main threads of the interviews and points to the parallels and divergences appearing from them this book offers a unique and important insight into the legal minds and outlook of a select group of prominent scholars of international law and legal institutions during the last years of the twentieth century

we highly recommend it not just for statistically terrified biology students and faculty but also for those who are occasionally anxious or uncertain in addition to being a good starting point to learn statistics it is a useful place to return to refresh your memory the quarterly review of biology march 2009 during the entire course of my ph d i ve been embarrasingly looking for a way to teach myself the fundamentals of statistical analysis at this point in my education i ve come to realize that often times simply knowing the basics is enough for you to properly apply even the most complex analytical methods statistics for terrified biologists has been just such a book it was more than worth the 40 i spent on it and while my book clubs aren t meant to be reviews i highly recommend the book to anyone who s in a similar predicament to my own carlo artieri s blog book club the typical biology student is hardwired to be wary of any tasks involving the application of mathematics and statistical analyses but the plain fact is much of biology requires interpretation of experimental data through the use of statistical methods
