the updated edition of this comprehensive overview of outsider art distinguished by its wider international scope and inclusion of global developments since 2000 outsider art is the work produced outside the mainstream of modern art by self taught untrained visionaries spiritualists recluses folk artists psychiatric patients prisoners and others beyond the imposed margins of society and the art market coined by roger cardinal in 1972 the term was intended as an english equivalent

to jean dubuffet's art brut literally raw art uncooked by culture unaffected by fashion unmoved by artistic standards in this comprehensive and indispensable guide colin rhodes surveys the history and reception of outsider art first championed by dubuffet and the surrealists now appreciated by a wider public this volume provides fresh insights into the achievements of both major figures and newly discovered artists as well as the emergence of specialized studios as the relationship between outsider art and the contemporary mainstream art world has developed and become more intertwined from spirit guided madge gill and schizophrenic adolf wölfli to rosemarie koczy's expressions of trauma and nek Chand's outdoor creations these individuals passionately pursue the pictorial expression of their vision now illustrated in full color with the exception of some archival photographs this new edition has been substantially revised with a greater focus on global outsider art as well as including more recent talents to the field

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what does it mean to be called an outsider marion scherr investigates structural inequalities and the myth of the other in western art history examining the role of outsider art in contemporary art worlds in the uk by shifting the focus from art world professionals to those labelled outsider artists she counteracts one sided representations of them being otherworldly raw and uninfluenced instead the artists are introduced as multi faceted individuals in constant exchange with their social environment employing diverse strategies in dealing with their exclusion the book reframes their voices and artworks as complex serious and meaningful cultural contributions and challenges their attested otherness in favour of a more inclusive all encompassing understanding of art

this spectacular volume reproduces in full color some 150 pieces from the anthony petullo collection an extraordinary assemblage of paintings and drawings produced by individuals working outside the perimeter of conventional art training and traditions some of the pieces are fanciful even whimsical others are haunting in their unembellished depiction of vulnerability and terror some are spare others are crowded with figures some exhibit a childlike simplicity others are almost sculpted in their precision and clarity the thirty six european and north american artists represented in self taught and outsider art include a hospital janitor a factory worker concentration camp survivors a truck driver a guard at the tate gallery a self proclaimed fortuneteller and healer and a female impersonator and hollywood screenwriter their canvases include paper wood long strips of calico cloth and cardboard one artist paints with both hands simultaneously another finds it difficult to paint except amid the chaos of his family many began painting quite late in life others had early dreams of pursuing art that were deferred by economic and family circumstances some have been institutionalized or incarcerated others have struggled with terrible poverty and personal loss perhaps more than the work of conventionally trained artists pieces by outsider or self taught artists are entwined with the identities of their creators in support of that connection self taught and outsider art presents the artworks in conjunction with portraits usually photographs of the artists and brief biographical sketches in some cases a friend or patron provides an anecdote about the artist taken together these offer an intimate glimpse of the process by which art emerges from experience

in this lucid and insightful essay renowned linguist roy harris reflects on the early nineteenth century doctrine of art for art s sake this was attacked by proudhon and nietzsche but defended by théophile gautier and e m forster it influenced movements as diverse as futurism and dada over the past two centuries three main positions have emerged the institutional view declares art to be a status conferred upon certain works by the approval of influential institutions the idiocentric view gives absolute priority to the judgment of the individual the third is the conceptual view of art which insists that what counts is the idea that inspired a work not the physical execution but as harris shows the tacit assumptions which once supported this debate and these positions have now collapsed art as a coherent category has imploded leaving behind a historical residue of empty questions that contemporary society can no longer answer the great debate about art provides much needed signposts for understanding this sorry state of affairs

how to look at outsider art is an invaluable resource to help navigate the aesthetics of this evolving field it provides an overview of the field s most exciting works some of them never before published in book form this book points out the challenges of assessing work offers guidelines for aesthetic and collecting judgments

this timely volume challenges the narrow western centrism of most art historical models archeologists have found that for tens of thousands of years all human cultures have shared a desire for visual representation or expression yet the study of art history has traditionally focused on western artworks of the past few centuries world art studies examines the phenomenon of art through a broader cultural global and temporal perspective bringing together a uniquely exhaustive range of perspectives on art and borrowing approaches from the study of neuroscience evolutionary biology anthropology and geography as models alongside more conventional art historical perspectives in musicology or linguistics using such diverse viewpoints for reflection and research is considered part of the normal process in that spirit this volume goes beyond abstract models using case studies to demonstrate and examine specific methods of investigation book jacket
