late 20th century social problems speeding up fast capitalism a sequel to his earlier book assesses social changes since the end of the 1980s brought about by information technologies like the internet which have quickened the pace of everyday life in speeding up fast capitalism agger assesses the impact of the internet on consciousness communication culture and community and evaluates the prospects of democratic social change where the earlier book was largely theoretical speeding up applies critical theory to specific topics such as internet culture work families childhood schooling food the body and fitness although indebted to fast capitalism the sequel appeals to an audience wider than theorists including empirical sociologists social scientists and scholars in cultural disciplines
