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drawing from the library of congress s massive collection this volume takes readers on a fascinating and informative journey through nearly 200 years of american children s books and periodicals depicting life in japan from fanciful travelogues full of exotic stereotypes to serious works about wartime atrocities published by rutgers university press in association with the library of congress

in the classics and children s literature between west and east a team of contributors from different continents offers a survey of the reception of classical antiquity in children s and young adults literature by applying regional perspectives

whether watching studio ghibli adaptations of british children s books visiting harry potter sites in britain or eating at alice in wonderland themed restaurants in tokyo the japanese have a close and multifaceted relationship with british children s literature in this the first comprehensive study to explore this engagement catherine butler considers its many manifestations in print on the screen in tourist locations and throughout japanese popular culture taking stock of the influence of literary works such as gulliver s travels alice s adventures in wonderland the tale of peter rabbit tom s midnight garden and the harry potter series this lively account draws on literary criticism translation film and tourist studies to explore how british children s books have been selected translated understood adapted and reworked into japanese commercial touristic and imaginative culture using theoretically informed case studies this book will consider both individual texts and their wider cultural contexts translations and adaptations such as the numerous adaptations of british children s books by studio ghibli and others the dissemination of distinctive tropes such as magical schools into japanese children s literature and popular culture and the ways in which british children s books and their settings have become part of way that japanese people understand britain itself

child neurology its origins founders evolution and growth second edition updates the first biographical study of important contributors to the field of child neurology consisting of over 250 biographical sketches written by over 100 physicians specializing in neurology child neurology pediatrics and obstetrics organized chronologically into six chapters beginning before 1800 and continuing to the present child neurology traces the emergence of child neurology as a separate specialty from its roots in pediatrics and neurology with a definitive historical introduction by the editor dr stephen ashwal this new edition will feature a new section on the dynamic growth and expansion of child neurology the late twentieth century 1960 to 2000 and features about 138 new biographical sketches of leaders in the field during this recent time frame child neurology its origins founders evolution and growth second edition will be published on behalf of the child neurology society a professional society that strives to foster recognition and support for children with neurological disorders and to promote and exchange national and international scientific research education and training in the field of neurology identifies top contributors to child neurology research from the 1800s to today includes 238 biographical sketches of contributors and their scientific research contains 138 new biographies on contributors from the late 20th and early 21st centuries authored by physicians and published by the child neurology society

this uniquely authoritative collection of original papers with contributions from over twenty countries provides a rare insight into research and applied programs in the study of individual differences in children and adolescents worldwide while delinquency proves to be one of the most common areas of interest a wide range of cognitive personality and social characteristics are examined and the use of the eysenck personality questionnaire in many studies allows uniform comparisons to be made between countries the editors have not only overcome the language barriers which hitherto have made such information virtually inaccessible to the english speaking world they have also succeeded in bringing together studies from developed and developing countries east and west to present a global picture of adolescent and child psychology in particular the book highlights the general and specific cultural influences on child development and adolescent psychology in different countries and reflects the social and research concerns of the countries and cultures represented the authors comprise a cross section of professionals in the social and behavioral sciences working in university and clinical settings while north america is well represented by six chapters including puerto rico as is europe particular efforts were made to obtain contributions from eastern europe asia and africa at the time this book was developed information exchange with eastern european countries was most difficult it is very exciting to present chapters from hungary lithuania romania russia and yugoslavia the inclusion of articles from japan korea singapore sri lanka and uganda also add another dimension to studies of individual differences in children contributions from australia israel and new zealand also allow the book to take on much more of an international perspective on topics ranging from delinquency fears and motivation to intelligence personality and assessment issues this volume provides a plethora of international perspectives on the study of children it will be essential to sociologists psychologists educators and child study specialists

this book contains a selective annotated bibliography of 304 japanese children's books that represent the years 1946 1985 and that are contained in the library of congress washington d c the volume presents an overview of the development and change in japanese children's literature in terms of 1 a new democratic philosophy 1946 1955 2 social reforms 1956 1965 3 an era between economic and social dreams and reality 1966 1975 and 4 the economic and social changes of the 1980s the titles are arranged by year and alphabetically by author under the categories of 1 children's books and periodicals 2 reference sources history and criticism exhibition catalogs and periodicals and 3 reprints of pre world war ii children's literature books and collections and anthologies titles appear in japanese and english and special awards are noted title author and artist indexes are provided jhp

volume one of reference work listing all children's books by australians together with children's books about australia from 1774 to 1972 entries provide physical descriptions dates publishers illustrations awards received and in some cases remarks on the content entries are arranged by author title and illustrator indexes are included

psychologists offer an increasing variety of services to the public among these services psychological assessment of personality and behavior continues to be a central activity one main reason is that other mental health professionals often do not possess a high level of competence in this area and when dealing with children and adolescents psychological assessment seems to take on an even greater role therefore it follows that comprehensive graduate level instruction in assessment should be a high priority for educators of psychologists who will work with these youth this textbook is organized into three sections consistent with the authors approach to teaching part i provides students with the psychological knowledge base necessary for modern assessment practice including historical perspectives measurement science child psychopathology ethical legal and cultural issues and the basics of beginning the assessment process part ii gives students a broad review of the specific assessment methods used by psychologists accompanied by specific advice regarding the usage and strengths and weaknesses of each method in part iii we help students perform some of the most sophisticated of assessment practices integrating and communicating assessment results and infusing assessment practice with knowledge of child development and psychopathology to assess some of the most common types of behavioral and emotional disorders in youth a text focusing on assessment practices must be updated every four to six years to keep pace with advances in test development for example several of the major tests reviewed in the text such as the behavioral assessment system for children and the child behavior checklist have undergone major revisions since the publication of the last edition making the current content outdated further another major test the conners rating scales is undergoing substantial revisions that should be completed before publication of the next edition finally the evidence for the validity of the tests and the recommendations for their appropriate use evolve as research accumulates and requires frequent updating to remain current for example there was a special issue of the journal of clinical child and adolescent psychology published focusing on evidenced based assessment of the major forms of childhood psychopathology that will need to be integrated into the chapters in part 3 this latter point reflects an important trend in the field that should influence the marketing of the book that is there are several initiatives being started in all of the major areas of applied psychology e.g. school clinical and counseling to promote evidenced based assessment practices these initiatives have all emphasized the need to enhance the training of graduate students in this approach to assessment this has been the orientation of this textbook from its first edition that is clinical assessment of child and adolescent personality and behavior has focused on using research to guide all recommendations for practice the ability of the textbook to meet this training need should be an important focus of marketing the book to training programs across all areas of applied psychology
