The book is divided into six sections: chemotherapy, haematopoietic stem cell transplantation, general surgery, radiotherapy, late effects of cancer therapies and palliative care. There is a brief commentary at the end of each section chapter by a novice author but experienced practitioner highlighting to the reader what is already known and what the section chapter adds to their current knowledge and practice.
