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brucoli great war collection at the university of south carolina an illustrated catalogue provides a reference tool for the study of one of the great watershed moments in history on both sides of the atlantic serving historians researchers and collectors

this volume without negating williams strong ties with modernism intends to dislodge this deeply ingrained critical positioning by presenting him as an overlooked figure in the emerging tradition of postmodernism the study advances the claim that williams clearly recognized this nascent discourse and rather than pursuing his earlier mode of writing consciously sought a new language for a rapidly changing cultural context drawing on wide ranging multidisciplinary critical texts this book will be of interest not only to williams scholars but to all those who continue to be intrigued by the elusive boundaries between word and image as well as modernism and postmodernism

this bibliography lists english language translations of twentieth century italian literature published chiefly in book form between 1929 and 1997 encompassing fiction poetry plays screenplays librettos journals and diaries and correspondence

from the new york times bestselling author of the great leader and legends of the fall a retired detective confronts the sins of man in rural michigan in the great leader mark twain award winning author jim harrison introduced readers to the hard drinking nearly retired detective sunderson in this darkly comic follow up sunderson takes stock of his past while his outlaw neighbors bring new havoc to his doorstep to flee his troubles detective sunderson buys a hunting cabin in a remote area of michigan s upper peninsula but with neighbors like the ames family there is no peace to be found armed to the teeth the ameses have local law enforcement too intimidated to take them on then sunderson s cleaning lady a comely young ames woman is murdered and black sheep brother lemuel ames seeks sunderson s advice on a crime novel he s writing which may not be fiction in a story shot through with wit bedlam and sunderson s contemplation of the seven deadly sins the big seven is a superb reminder of why jim harrison is one of the finest writers of the past half century the washington times

this comprehensive collection describes all the published works by one of america s most

famous and prolific dramatists author of *Glass Menagerie* a streetcar named desire cat on a hot tin roof and many other dramas presented on both stage and screen tennessee williams was also the writer of short stories poetry novels essays and autobiography

a compelling revision of the history of experimental writing from pound and stein to language poetry disclosing its uses and its limits in this bold new study of twentieth century american writing and poetics natalia cecire argues that experimental writing should be understood as a historical phenomenon before it is understood as a set of formal phenomena this seems counterintuitive because at its most basic level experimental writing can be thought of as writing which breaks from established forms touching on figures who are not typically considered experimental such as stephen crane jacob riis busby berkeley ursula k le guin and gottlob frege experimental offers a fresh look at authors who are often treated as constituting a center or an origin point of an experimental literary tradition in the united states including gertrude stein ezra pound william carlos williams and marianne moore in responding to a crisis of legitimization in the production of knowledge this tradition borrows and transforms the language of the sciences drawing upon terminology from the history of science cecire invokes the epistemic virtue which tethers ethical values to the production of knowledge in order to organize diverse turn of the century knowledge practices feeding into experimental writing using these epistemic virtues as a structuring concept for the book s argument cecire demonstrates that experimental writing as we now understand it does not do experiments as in follow a method but rather performs epistemic virtues experimental texts embody the epistemic virtues of flash objectivity precision and contact associated respectively with population sciences neuroanatomy natural history and toolmaking and anthropology yet which virtues take precedence may vary widely as may the literary forms through which they manifest bringing it up to the 1980s cecire reveals the american experimental literary tradition as a concerted and largely successful rewriting of twentieth century literary history she shows how the language poets a group of primarily white experimental writers restored to the canon what they saw as modernism s true legacy whose stakes were simultaneously political and epistemological it produced a poet who was an intellectual and a text that was experimental

william carlos williams was an inventive writer never confined by any static genre or aesthetic postulate in this authoritative study bernard duffey recognizes that literary dynamism as he approaches the full breadth of williams's work including his poetry prose fiction and drama as an interrelated and interdependent web of writing the result the first truly comprehensive examination of a major american author and his kinetic art will interest students and scholars of williams american literature and modern poetry and criticism central to duffey's study is a critical framework based on kenneth burke's a grammar of motives and the perception of the poet as an agent working in relation to a scene and its content in this case the geographical and cultural locale that williams clung to williams's work duffey argues was informed by the dramatic sense of himself as a literary actor seeking embodiment of a dynamic altering whole and his present condition of being ultimately he stresses the writer was more engaged in expressing literary action than in forging literary objects duffey amplifies this critical view through a close reading of specific works examining williams's principal writings in the lights that seem most immediate to them he tackles a variety of themes the pervasiveness of scene in in the american grain and the fiction the role of agent or poetic person in kora in hell a voyage to pagany paterson and pictures from brueghel the function of poetic agency in the short poems and of poetic action in williams's drama

providing the most complete record possible of texts by italian writers active after 1900 this annotated bibliography covers over 4 800 distinct editions of writings by some 1 700 italian authors many entries are accompanied by useful notes that provide information on the authors works translators and the reception of the translations this book includes the works of pirandello calvino eco and more recently andrea camilleri and valerio manfredi together with robin healey's italian literature before 1900 in english translation also published by university of toronto press in 2011 this volume makes comprehensive information on translations from italian accessible for schools libraries and those interested in comparative literature

do you feel it too explores a new sense of self that is becoming manifest in experimental fiction written by a generation of authors who can be considered the heirs of the postmodern tradition it offers a precise in depth analysis of a new post postmodern direction in fiction writing and highlights which aspects are most acute in the post postmodern novel most notable is the emphatic expression of feelings and sentiments and a drive toward inter subjective connection and communication the self that is presented in these post postmodern works of fiction can best be characterized as relational to analyze this new sense of self a new interpretational method is introduced that offers a sophisticated approach to fictional selves combining the insights of post classical narratology and what is called narrative psychology close analyses of three contemporary experimental texts infinite jest 1996 by david foster wallace a heartbreaking work of staggering genius 2000 by dave eggers and house of leaves 2000 by mark danielewski provide insight into the typical problems that the self experiences in postmodern cultural contexts three such problems or symptoms are singled out and analyzed in depth an inability to choose because of a lack of decision making tools a difficulty to situate or appropriate feelings and a structural need for a we a desire for connectivity and sociality the critique that can be distilled from these texts especially on the perceived solipsistic quality of postmodern experience worlds runs parallel to developments in recent critical theory these developments in fiction and theory both signal in the wake of poststructural conceptions of subjectivity a perhaps much awaited turn to the human in our culture at large today
