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the sixth edition of british cultural identities assesses the degree to which being british impinges on the identity of the many people who belong to contemporary britain twenty first century british identity is analysed through the various and changing ways in which people who live in the uk position themselves and are positioned by their culture using examples from contemporary and popular culture each chapter covers one of eight intersecting themes including places and peoples education work and leisure gender sex and the family youth culture and style class and politics ethnicity and language religion and heritage this new edition is fully updated to include the latest information on britain in the 2020s it explains the influences that shape british identities and outlines the important current debates stemming from cultural social and political change considering contemporary touchstones and recent national statistics the contributors place modern british life in the context of the activities events and society found in the uk across recent decades the book is the perfect introductory text for students of contemporary british society containing photographs tables timelines discussion questions cultural examples and suggestions for further resources at the end of each chapter

this book should be of use to undergraduates reading modern british history as well as students of modern british culture and society

collocation is an important tool in describing lexical behaviour in language and has received increasing attention in recent years based on two corpora locness the louvain corpus of native english essays and mlc the non english major mainland chinese learner corpus this book explores the features of chinese learner english with analysis of grammatical and lexical collocations the findings show that chinese university students use collocations with considerably less variety and chinese language and culture exert a substantial influence on their english writing it also discusses ways to tackle the problems chinese english learners face and the pedagogical implications for teaching english and learning english collocations as one of the first systematic studies to investigate collocations in chinese learner english based on learner corpora this book not only analyzes how chinese learners use collocations in their english writing but also provides significant implications for foreign language teaching and learning

after an introductory chapter that provides an overview to theoretical issues in tense aspect modality and evidentiality this volume presents a variety of original contributions that are firmly empirically grounded based on elicited or corpus data while adopting different theoretical frameworks thus some chapters rely on large diachronic corpora and provide new qualitative insight on the evolution of tam systems through quantitative methods while others carry out a collostructional analysis of past tensed verbs using inferential statistics to explore the lexical grammar of verbs a common goal is to uncover semantic regularities and variation in the tam systems of the languages under study by taking a close look at context such a fine grained approach contributes to our understanding of the tam systems from a typological perspective the focus on well known indo european languages e g french german english spanish and also on less commonly studied languages e g hungarian estonian avar andi tagalog provides a valuable cross linguistic perspective

speaking is a dynamic interpersonal process and one that strongly influences how we are perceived by others in a range of formal and everyday contexts despite this speaking is often researched and taught as if it is simply writing delivered in a different mode in teaching and researching speaking rebecca hughes suggests that we have less understanding than we might of important meaning making aspects of speech such as prosody gaze affect and the ways speakers collaborate and negotiate with one another in interaction this thoroughly revised and updated second edition looks to the future of the field offering a new chapter on assessment discussing high stakes oral language testing contexts such as immigration new material considering access to spoken data via the worldwide web and new technologies that allow neurolinguistic insights formerly hidden from view summaries and case studies to help the reader understand how to approach researching speaking and encourages practitioners to question the models of speaking that they are using in their classrooms reviewing materials and assessment practices in the light of current knowledge about spoken language and highlighting areas for new work and collaboration between researchers and practitioners this book will be a valuable resource for anyone involved in language teaching

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
