Displaced populations continue to suffer due to the major conflicts in Syria, Iraq, and elsewhere, causing fragmentation and disintegration of communities. significantly from previous migration refugee flows in the region explain the historical and political antecedents of this crisis which have played a part in its shaping and explore the relationship between human security and the protection of vulnerable individuals and groups
