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asking questions examines a central phenomenon of language the use of sentences to ask questions although there is a sizable literature on the syntax and semantics of interrogatives the logic of questions and the speech act of questioning no one has tried to put the syntax and semantics together with the speech acts over the full range of phenomena we pretheoretically think of as asking questions robert fiengo not only does this but also takes up some more foundational issues in the theory of language by positioning the findings of contemporary grammatical theorizing within the larger domain of language use fiengo challenges the use theorist to acknowledge the importance of grammatical form and the grammarian to acknowledge the importance of use in addition to developing an austrian distinction between four questioning speech acts and a proposal concerning the philosophy of language asking questions contains a useful discussion of the type token distinction and how use of language compares with use of other things fiengo also considers the nature of multiple questions revealing what one must know to ask them and what speech acts one may perform when asking them asking questions advances our understanding of a wide range of issues in a number of important respects scholars and students of linguistics and philosophy will find plenty to interest them in this pioneering work

importance of issues such as researcher subjectivity type of annotation the limitations and affordances of different corpus tools the relative strengths of qualitative and quantitative approaches and the value of considering data or information beyond the corpus rather than attempting to find the best approach the focus of the volume is on how different corpus linguistic methodologies may complement one another and raises suggestions for further methodological studies which use triangulation to enrich corpus related research

aristotle famously maintains in his treatise on the soul that there are three kinds of living things plants animals and humans and he speaks of each kind as having a soul st thomas aquinas adopts these same views nowadays however many thinkers reject them on the grounds that they are incompatible with modern science molecular biology is seen as affording a superior way of categorizing life forms evolutionary biology appears to have established that humans are simply primates with adaptations somewhat different from other primates plant physiology uncovering plants directional responses to a wide variety of different stimuli provides reason to think that plants sense light pressure odor pathogens etc in which case plants are simply non mobile animals similar to coral neuroscience by showing the dependency of thought choice perception and emotion on the central nervous system especially on the brain seems to have eliminated any need to posit a soul plants animals people aliens addresses these and a variety of other science based claims about living things by bringing aristotelian thomistic teachings to bear upon them while not a systematic work it both treats some of the most hotly debated philosophical questions concerning living things such as what it means to be alive as well as treating questions less often raised by philosophers such as whether animals have a

theory of mind though geared primarily to those conversant with the aristotelian thomistic tradition many of its key concepts are traced back to experiences that we all share in common thus rendering these concepts intelligible if not convincing to those with scientific and other backgrounds who are curious about this philosophical approach to living things the author strives to show how aristotelian thomistic philosophy and science complement one another by sketching out the fuller understanding of the living realm that the two together provide the book s final section considers the possibility and the likelihood that embodied rational beings exist elsewhere in our universe here theological arguments drawn from the christian faith are presented alongside philosophical and scientific arguments this section closes with a theological discussion of the disputed question of whether extraterrestrials were they to exist should be baptized
