that reason finds this help only in the revelation of the god's covenantal relation with the world the first principle of all things most perfectly revealed in Jesus Christ perfect god and perfect man is really and freely related to us only by accepting this revealed prime analogate can the transcendental analogies bear fruit in our ongoing quest for understanding
