watson provides professional and amateur musicians and music lovers generally with a complete survey of beethoven s chamber music and the background to each individual work the loyalty of patrons musicians and friends on the one hand increasing deafness and uncertain health on the other attention is paid to the influence of such large scale compositions as the eroica symphony and fidelio on the chamber music of his middle years and the missa solemnis and the ninth symphony on his late quartets the author examines beethoven s ever increasing freedom of form largely a result of his mastery of improvisation and a powerful symbol of the fusion of classical discipline with the subversive spirit of romantic adventure which characterises his mature music beethoven s friends were not shy about asking him what his music meant or what inspired him and it is clear that he attached the greatest importance to the words he used when describing the character of his compositions the tempo is more like the body he wrote when commending malzel s invention of the metronome but these indications of character certainly refer to the spirit angus watson a violinist and conductor has been director of music at stowe school winchester college and wells cathedral school one of britain s specialist music schools from 1984 1989 he was dean of music at the newly founded hong kong academy for performing arts

musician and composer dean notes that most accounts of modern jazz have taken a biographical approach instead he discusses the music itself the emerging performance composition and improvisation styles and suggests where to find recorded examples annotation copyrighted by book news inc portland or

presents fifteen original blues compositions in various keys styles and grooves together with downloadable recordings of 40 of the 50 examples in the book the audio tracks are presented both with and without the lead piano part so the student can play along with a professional rhythm section which includes piano vibraphone alto flute drums and bass historical and performance notes are provided with each blues composition the author enlisted the skills of jazz pianist charlie freeman in editing the book and providing fingering for both the treble and bass piano parts making these pieces more accessible to novice players Ê if your knowledge of blues theory or terminology is lacking this is the book for you author vince corozine thoroughly explores and demonstrates blues and pentatonic scale theory blue notes grace notes pedal points tremolos trills syncopation anticipation delayed beats slash chords boogie woogie left hand patterns walking bass stride piano style straight eighths swing eighths passing tones rolled chords riffs filler chords substitutions and comping styles Ê this book also includes essential blues chord theory as well as tips on tasteful chord voicing presented in the context of accompanying a soloist comping in addition the chord progressions represented by the written notation are carefully annotated in every example in the book the appendix includes helpful tips on comping practice and jazz soloing plus a list of noteworthy jazz pianists a key to chord symbols and a glossary of jazz terms used in the book if you are not a competent blues pianist when you first pick up this book you will be by the time you complete it includes access to online audio

this well organized book combines all of the techniques that jazz musicians practice into a comprehensive whole it covers practice patterns and scales in all keys and tempos transcribing solos of master improvisers learning the jazz repertoire and playing with other musicians chapter topics include how to practice creatively improvise and teach improvisation major innovators important contributors women in jazz chord substitutions scales and form each chapter also contains theory and ear exercises

for all guitarists interested in improvising the material in this method can apply to any style of music this integrated approach to soloing provides numerous musical examples promotes an understanding of the theory behind improvising and also promotes better visualization of shapes on the fingerboard through the use of fingerboard diagrams the material presented in this comprehensive book ranges from fundamental concepts such as understanding modes and scale and chord relationships to the application of various scales arpeggios and chromaticism in addition more advanced areas are explored such as combining scales using extensions and superimposing includes standard notation and tablature as well as fingerboard diagrams the included cd demonstrates many of the examples in the book
