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this book delineates the contours of muslim political articulation and its contribution to democracy in the telugu region it examines the emergence of muslim politics from the debris of police action in 1948 in the context of the formation of the first linguistic state of andhra

pradesh in 1956 taking linguistic nationalism caste politics and discourse around social reform as its scaffolding it discusses how muslims negotiated concerns around their belonging and citizenship in mainstream politics public policy literary writing language activism religious education and in women s movement this book will be an indispensable resource for scholars and researchers of political studies historians of deccan and the telugu region minority studies exclusion studies indian politics indian democracy modern indian history and political sociology it will also serve as a useful introductory text for activists and general readers interested in muslim politics

insular southeast asia is made up of six nations which are characterised by an extraordinary diversity of cultures and languages consequently oral tradition in the region is similarly heterogeneous and may be performed in poetry storytelling singing or a combination of all three its study may be perceived from various academic angles the present edition contains eleven contributions which discuss oral tradition from different perspectives covering ecocriticism poetics semiotics linguistics folkloristics and politics this volume explores expressions of oral folklore from different corners of insular southeast asia and exemplifies diverse and alternative approaches to oral poetry and storytelling

the collection of post independence telugu short stories reflects all the major trends and thematic concerns of the telugu short stories of the post independence period the telugu short story right from its inception in 1910 has demonstrated its serious engagement with social issues and is imbued with a strong sense of social awareness and responsiveness the post independence telugu short story continued this tradition in terms of its thematic preoccupations the selection comes from different regions of andhra pradesh andhra coastal districts rayalaseema and telangana and record with rare sensitivity the specificities of the sub cultures of these regions the stories trace the impact of all the important socio political movements that have swept across the telugu land in the post independence era socialism communism feminism civil right movement and the dalit movement the lives of telugu people urban and rural upper middle class middle class and the downtrodden professionals and beggars are represented in a rich mosaic of differences

a major activity of the sahitya akademi is the preparation of an encyclopaedia of indian literature the venture covering twenty two languages of india is the first of its kind written in english the encyclopaedia gives a comprehensive idea of the growth and development of indian literature the entries on authors books and general topics have been tabulated by the concerned advisory boards and finalised by a steering committee hundreds of writers all over the country contributed articles on various topics the encyclopaedia planned as a six volume project has been brought out the sahitya akademi embarked upon this project in right earnest in 1984 the efforts of the highly skilled and professional editorial staff started showing results and the first volume was brought out in 1987 the second volume was brought out in 1988 the third in 1989 the fourth in 1991 the fifth in 1992 and the sixth volume in 1994 all the six volumes together include approximately 7500 entries on various topics literary trends and movements eminent authors and significant works the first three volume were edited by prof amaresh datta fourth and fifth volume by mohan lal and sixth volume by shri k c dutt

the end century edition of the who s who of indian writers is an invaluable work of reference for writers publishers readers and students of literary history for ease of use the entries are arranged alphabetically by surname or part of the name preferred by the writers themselves a large number of cross references are provided to facilitate the location and identification of the writers

the enormous body of short story anthologies from the nineteen countries of spanish america and brazil testifies to their importance for writers editors readers and especially for schools and universities teachers and students the study of anthologies and their contents can be particularly revealing for many of the questions looming large in critical discourse particularly those on canon formation and the relations between literature and cultural institutions but researching this corpus is difficult because it varies greatly in quality distribution and format the present volume for the first time gathers this mass of material and organizes it for systematic study the main section comprises annotated listings of 1302 short story anthologies those with stories from all or most of the countries grouped together including a section of english language anthologies those from countries of a region and those from individual nations for most entries a full listing of contents is provided along with brief commentary a second section comprises annotated bibliographies of criticism of the short story similarly arranged with materials for latin america as a whole as well as regionally and nationally the volume ends with four indexes of authors of the stories of authors of essays introductions and other critical materials of titles of the critical works and of themes an essential tool for scholars working on latin american narrative this bibliography will also serve as a practical finding aid for individual writers and stories
