this book analyzes teacher quality in latin america and the caribbean which is the key to faster education progress based on new research in 15 000 classrooms in seven different countries it documents the sources of low teacher quality and distills the global evidence on practical policies that can help the region produce great teachers

opportunities for growth and investment in central america could well improve in the coming years as the region s ties with the world economy grow closer this integration however also presents important challenges for economic policy to ensure that growth can be sustained and can benefit the poor this book stresses the importance of keeping fiscal policy on a sustainable path strengthening public investment in basic infrastructure and primary health care and

primary and secondary education and managing the risks associated with partial dollarization

an in depth look at a profession that is alternately valued and reviled but is consistently a microcosm of society library journal the american teacher a history is as the title makes clear a history of teachers in the united states supported by hundreds of research studies done over the years as reported in scholarly journals the book fills a niche in the history of education sociology gender studies and the united states as a whole k 12 teachers and to a lesser extent college university teachers are discussed in the work which travels through the past century told chronologically and divided into ten decades the american teacher sheds light on the important role that teachers have played in this country over the last one hundred years the subject is parsed through the voices of educators intellectuals and journalists who have weighed in on its many different dimensions from the 1920s right up to today the american teacher is a key site of race gender and class we learn from a survey of its history revealing some of the tensions embedded in our constructed social divisions controversy has always surrounded teachers in the united states making them a fascinating subject to explore in depth the schoolteacher has long served as a principal player in american culture making the american teacher a kind of character study that distinguishes fact from fiction rather than a research study itself the work draws on the most important scholarship that has been completed over the years the work is a big sweeping picture of the history of american teachers that is designed to complement more academic books that take a more in depth analysis of unique topics with original research and in place of focusing on a particular topic the book examines the threads that have connected issues such as gender and economic status over time in short the american teacher is a synthetic narrative driven study that brings together in one place the essential research in the field and like any good history the book shows how mining the stuff of everyday life serves as the richest way to learn more about a group of people at a particular time and in a particular place

and youth themselves could learn from these critical transformative and anticolonial youthful pedagogies for being with education this book will appeal to scholars students policymakers and practitioners in the areas of youth studies education social justice sociology human rights wellbeing and social work

this edited volume presents an integrated vision around the processes of science teaching and learning in latin american schools existing scientific literacy findings varies greatly between students influenced by gender ethnicity and socio economic status as well as location this book provides systematic and cohesive insights grounded in the existing literature to move towards equitable science education it critically analysis existing literature from the field to guide future research it discusses various research projects developed in latin america as examples for researchers and educators it provides guidelines to improve science teaching and learning processes at school level by bringing together the main contributions of the region to this project it allows findings to be accessible to non spanish speaking readers this book provides contextualized insight into the main topics in the field rethinking science education in latin america and identifyingreform efforts it is of interest to teachers teacher educators researchers and policy makers

politics of education in latin america reforms resistance and persistence portrays complex situations of education change policies in latin america from argentina and chile the southernmost part of the continent to mexico the northernmost the analyses tour through brazil peru colombia ecuador el salvador and cuba to conclude with a chapter that scrutinizes why the big teacher unions reject most attempts at education reforms in these teachers are the target of criticism and at the same time the focus of the expectations for progress and better educational quality readers will find a variety of contentious issues such as inclusion equity privatization uses of power and dialectics between the indications of intergovernmental

organizations and the rejection of their recommendations by local political actors they will also find narratives to raise public education participation improve the quality of life of teachers and put local education systems to dialogue with the global world the politics of education in latin america is a territory that groups and institutions continue to dispute since the establishment of their education systems
