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islam is a major religion in southeast asia with indonesian muslims comprising the largest muslim population in the world events and developments since 11 september 2001 have added greater attention to islam and its adherents in this part of the world this general survey of islam in southeast asia is intended to inform explain and update readers about the more significant aspects of islam in southeast asia then and now these include the following the geographical origins and sources by which the faith spread in this region the

social economic and political profiles of the muslim communities relations between muslims and non muslims and between muslims and the state the strands and trends that shapes the role of islam and the muslims in the national body politic and the challenges confronting muslims in confronting the vicissitudes of their lives in this era of rapid change characterized by modernization capitalism secularization and globalization the discussion will begin with an overview of the broad picture of islam and the muslims in the region as a whole covering both muslim majority and muslim minority countries this will be followed by case study analysis of islam and the muslims in individual countries indonesia malaysia brunei singapore thailand philippines myanmar vietnam cambodia and laos given the difficulty of writing on such a complex and contentious topic this book attempts to present the subject matter in a manner that is sufficiently objective to scholars and yet simple and accessible enough to be readily understood by ordinary readers

although more than half of the world s muslims live in asia most books on contemporary islam focus on the middle east giving short shift to the dynamic and diverse presence of asian islam in regional and global politics the muslims of asia constitute the largest muslim communities in the world indonesia pakistan bangladesh india and central asia in recent years terrorist bombings in bali separatist conflicts in thailand and the philippines and opposition politics in central asia all point to the strategic importance of asian islam in asian islam in the 21st century terrorism and its effects are placed within the broader context of muslim politics and how islamic ideals and movements mainstream and extremist have shaped asian muslim societies democratization experiments successful and unsuccessful are examined the rise of radical militant movements is analyzed and placed in historical perspective the result is an insightful portrait of the rich diversity of muslim politics and discourse that continue to affect asian muslim majority and minority countries specialists and students of islamic studies religion and international affairs and comparative politics as well as general readers will benefit from this sorely needed comprehensive analysis of a part of the world that has become increasingly important in the 21st century

this series of volumes on the manifold facets of islamic culture is intended to acquaint a very wide public with the theological bases of its faith the status of the individual and of society in the islamic world its expansion since the revelation its cultural manifestations in literature and the arts and finally islam today between loyalty to its past and the new challenges of modernity the last 100 years of islamic history are examined in the final volume although the approach is thematic rather than historical the period considered has seen european colonialism in most of the islamic world and islam has played a major role in the initiation and organization of resistance movements we survey the groupings and forms of co operation that have arisen since liberation from colonialism and investigate the political necessity and the moral stand that underlie the unity of the islamic peoples social and economic progress is reviewed and space is devoted to such topics as the ongoing problem of palestine moves towards educational reform and the status of women in islam as the islamic world cannot be imagined in isolation this volume examines the attitude of contemporary islam towards other religions and cultures and considers efforts aimed at achieving mutual understanding and coexistence in both muslim and non muslim countries

religious observance prayer fasting dress pilgrimage has accompanied the creation of new institutions mosques finance houses insurance companies schools clinics and hospitals religiously inspired social and political movements have proliferated only a few decades ago muslims were virtually invisible in europe and america today increased immigration has changed the religious landscape of the west mosques and islamic centers are found in european and american cities and towns muslims are visible in nearly every area of social and political life a list of major islamic cities and populations today must include not only cairo tunis damascus and islamabad but also paris london new york and detroit this demographic and cultural shift requires that we speak not only of the relationship between the traditional islamic world and the west but also about islam in the west it has also meant that islam has been obliged to modernize to grapple with its status as a minority religion in some parts of the world and a majority one in others modernizing islam speaks to the significance origins influences and implications of islam s changes and thus to the various ways in which this religion is becoming a truly global force shaping such realms as law politics education and ethics among many others

because many scholars and writers actually claim that syria is already a secularist country which is a highly controversial and debatable claim secondly because the political islam in syria does not have the same power it has in other muslim arabic countries and this makes syria a somehow good candidate for becoming a secularist country this paper contains four main chapters and it is structured as follows after the introduction in the first chapter secularism and secularization is briefly defined and then it will explained why the religion islam and the political islam cannot be separated in the second chapter it is presented the point of view which says that islam is deep inside incompatible with secularism on the contrary side namely in the third chapter it is presented the other point of view which claims that islam can very well come along with secularism the fourth chapter will be the conclusion furthermore a connection with syria based on the content of the chapters will be made at the end of the first and the last chapter

this book shifts analytical focus from macro politicization and securitization of islam to muslims choices practices and public expressions of faith an empirically rich analysis the book provides rich cross country evidence on the emergence of autonomous faith communities as well as the evolution of islam in the broader european context

based on a reading of classical islamic literature the writings of modern muslims and on extensive travel and interviews this book discusses ways in which muslim peoples adapt themselves to a world composed of sovereign nation states having peaceful and equal relations with both non muslim states and collectivities of other muslims the

classical and medieval legal theory of islam appears to place two obstacles in the way of such adaptations it divides the world into two areas muslim and non muslim between which relations can at best be those of truce and it demands that the life of societies should be regulated by the will of god as revealed in the qu ran not by the will of rulers or of the people dr piscatori shows that the traditional theory provides for some degree of territorial pluralism which has been clearly reflected in the historical experience whereby stable nation states have emerged and become part of the international order

covering the period 1963 to 1986 this study demonstrates the degree of influence that islam exerts on malay identity islam is not only a focal point in relations between malays and non malays but also in the malay ethnic community since islam is integral to its culture and identity and is involved in a tense dialectical relationship with malay ethnicity the malay tendency to opt for ethnic malay based solutions instead of an islamic alternative results in an upsurge of malay ethnic nationalism and is here explored against the backdrop of the current islamic resurgence in malaysia

there has been a significant upsurge of western interest in the political manifestations and significance of islam in the last decade fuelled by the notion of islamic revival the iranian revolution and by events in countries as diverse as egypt pakistan and sudan oil power and its effect on the international economic order the relationship of muslim countries with the superpowers and the continuation of the arab israeli conflict have also served to focus attention on islamic politics and in particular on the notion of islamic reassertion as the author of this book argues one result of this interest has been the development of a view of islam as monolithic and implacable he takes a broad view of the intellectual and cultural history of islam emphasising the extraordinary diversity of islamic societies and the ways in which the ideal is often pragmatically adapted to reality in this wider social and historical context the nature of islamic revival is then reassessed first published in 1988

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
