this book discusses issues in generating coherent effective natural language descriptions with integrated text and examples this is done in the context of a system for generating documentation dynamically from the underlying software representations good documentation is critical for user acceptance of any complex system advances in areas such as knowledge based systems natural language and multimedia generation now make it possible to investigate the automatic generation of documentation from the underlying knowledge bases this has several important benefits it is always accessible it is always current because the documentation reflects the underlying representation and it can take the communication context such as the user into account the work described in this book compiles results from cognitive psychology and education on effective presentation of examples as well as work on computational generation of examples from intelligent tutoring systems it also takes into account computational learning from examples and a characterization of good examples for just this purpose issues arising from these research areas as well as issues coming from the author's own corpus analysis of instructional and explanatory texts are discussed in the context of generating natural language descriptions of software constructs a text planner is used for a hierarchy of communicative goals examples are treated as an integral part of the planning process and their interaction with text is represented at all stages the strengths and limitations of this approach are also discussed although the focus of this book is the generation of natural language descriptions a similar set of issues need to be addressed in the generation of multimedia

descriptions this book will be of interest to all researchers working in the areas of natural language interfaces intelligent tutoring systems documentation and technical writing and educational psychology

in his account of text and textual meaning pettersson demonstrates that a text as commonly conceived is not only a verbal structure but also a physical entity two kinds of phenomena which do not in fact add up to a unitary object he describes this current notion of text as convenient enough for many practical purposes but inadequate in discussions of a theoretically more demanding nature having clearly demonstrated its intellectual drawbacks he develops an alternative boldly revisionary way of thinking about text and textual meaning his careful argument is in challenging dialogue with assumptions about language in use to be found in a wide range of present day literary theory linguistics philosophical aesthetics and philosophy of language

until now there has been very little research into the use of online dictionaries in contrast the market for online dictionaries is increasing both for academic lexicography and for commercial lexicography with sales figures for printed reference works in continual decline this has led to a demand for reliable empirical information on how online dictionaries are actually being used and how they could be made more user friendly the volume using online dictionaries makes a substantial contribution to closing this research gap it is divided into four parts the first part contains articles on fundamental issues a research review of the empirical studies on digital dictionaries which have already been carried out and a brief methodological guideline for lexicographical researchers who are interested in conducting their own empirical research the second part contains the results of two studies that focus on general questions about the use of online dictionaries it presents empirical data on contexts of dictionary use on expectations

and demands regarding online dictionaries furthermore innovative features such as the use of multimedia elements or the option of a user adaptive interface and questions of design were assessed empirically the third part of this volume comprises more specific studies of online dictionaries an eye tracking study evaluating the new web design of the dictionary portal owid and a log file study which tries to get to the bottom of the following question do dictionary users look up frequent words or put differently is there a connection between how often a word is looked up and how often it appears in a corpus in the last chapter of this thematic section the question of how users judge the combination of a written paraphrase and an additional illustration in illustrated online dictionaries is addressed the last part focuses on the use of monolingual dictionaries in particular the german online dictionary elexiko in this context two online questionnaire based studies were carried out the empirical studies were conducted in the form of online surveys combining questionnaires and experimental elements and in the form of laboratory studies using eye tracking technology as well as using observational methods such as log file analyses regarding the comprehensive research framework this volume can be relevant to lexicographers metalexicographers and linguists who are interested in the use of online dictionaries and in the development and exploration of lexicographical data for the internet as well as linguists interested in empirical methods it addresses a broad expert audience by presenting an academic subject which is currently the focus of much discussion

this book presents a first comprehensive typological analysis of noun phrases in australian languages covering the domains of classification qualification quantification determination and constituency the analysis is based on a representative sample of 100 languages among other points the results call into question the classic idea that australian languages tend to lack phrasal structures in the nominal domain with over two thirds of the languages showing evidence for phrasehood moreover it is argued that it may be more interesting to typologise languages on the basis of where and how they allow phrasal structure rather than on the basis of a yes no answer to the question of constituency the analysis also shows that a determiner slot can be identified in about half of the languages even though they generally lack classic determiner features like obligatory use in particular

contexts or a restriction to one determiner per np special attention is given to elements which can be used both inside and beyond determiner slots demonstrating how part of speech and functional structure do not always align the book is of interest to researchers documenting australian languages as well as to typologists and theorists
