carol tavis written for the times literary supplement the chronicle of higher education american scientist and the new york times book review these reviews apply psychological research and principles of scientific thinking to ideas presented in the books they aim to show how critical thinking can help people assess arguments promoted in the popular culture and how to separate those that are scientifically sound from those based on psychobabble pop psych notions dressed up in fancy sciency sounding language these essays may be used to encourage debate in the classroom or as a basis for student papers students can be asked to write or present their own points of view on a topic drawing on other research and the guidelines of critical thinking defined and described in a prefatory note to the reader to support their conclusions although these reviews can be used in many social science and composition courses the topics covered and the critical thinking guidelines that apply to them correspond to specific material in carole wade and carol tavis s psychology and invitation to psychology

aging skin whose body is this anyway who am i now naomi watts shares the most up to date research on how to manage menopause symptoms and tackle the physical and emotional challenges we encounter as we age irreverent bold and reassuring dare i say it is the companion every woman needs to embrace the best version of herself as she moves into what can be the most powerful and satisfying period of her life

this edited collection addresses the institutional context and social issues in which teaching the women s studies introductory course is embedded and provides readers with practical classroom strategies to meet the challenges raised the collection serves as a resource and preparatory text for all teachers of the course including experienced teachers less experienced teachers new faculty and graduate student teaching assistants the collection will also be of interest to educational scholars of feminist and progressive pedagogies and all teachers interested in innovative practices the contributors discuss the larger political context in which the course has become a central representative of women s studies to a growing although less feminist identified population increased enrollments and changes in student population are noted as a result in part of the popularity of introduction to women s studies courses in fulfilling ged and diversity requirements new forms of student resistance in a climate of backlash and changes in course content in response to internal and external challenges are also discussed evidence is provided for an emerging paradigm in the conceptualization of the introductory course as a result of challenges to racism heterosexism and classism in women s studies voiced by women of color and others in the 1980s and 1990s sensationalist charges that women s studies teachers including those who teach the introduction to women s studies course are the academic shock troops of a monolithic feminism are challenged and refuted by the collection s contributors who share their struggles to make possible classrooms in which informed dialogue and disagreement are valued

compiles a variety of approaches among them scientific research reports theoretical discussions and phenomenological descriptions of women's lives also includes an analysis of social cultural and historical influences on individual psychology and highlights women whose lives are under represe

evidence analyzing assumptions and biases one's own and those of others avoiding emotional reasoning not oversimplifying considering other interpretations and tolerating uncertainty focuses on important areas such as science vs pseudoscience controversies in child development the politics and science of gender research applying psychology to social issues and mental disorder and treatment individual essay topics include for example the popularity of predictions thinking critically about alternative medicine thinking critically about mystical messages the working mother debate how much influence do mothers have how much influence do parents have how critical are the first years of life the interpretation of differences the paradox of gender biological politics and the study of gender emotional epidemics and their consequences the daycare sex abuse scandals adolescent violence the limits of medication and thinking critically about psychotherapy for anyone who wants to explore the psychological basis of current popular culture issues and to engage in and strengthen the critical thinking skills
