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during the second world war the bodleian library in oxford acquired a set of aramaic letters eight sealings and the two leather bags in which the sealed letters were once stored the letters concern the affairs of aršāma satrap of egypt in the later fifth century taken with other material associated with him mostly in aramaic demotic egyptian and akkadian they illuminate the achaemenid world of which aršāma was a privileged member and evoke a wide range of social economic cultural organizational and political perspectives from multi lingual communication storage and disbursement of resources and satrapal remuneration to cross regional ethnic movement long distance travel religious practice and iconographic projection of ideological messages particular highlights include a travel authorization the only example of something implicit in numerous persepolis documents texts about the religious life of the judaeen garrison at elephantine aršāma s magnificent seal a masterpiece of achaemenid glyptic inherited from a son of darius i and echoes of temporary disturbances to persian management of egypt but what is also impressive is the underlying sense of systematic coherence founded on and expressed in the use of formal even formalized written communication as a means of control the aršāma dossier is not alone in evoking that sense but its size variety and focus upon a single individual give it a unique quality though this material has not been hidden from view it has been insufficiently explored it is the purpose of the three volumes of aršāma and his world the bodleian letters in context to provide the fullest presentation and historical contextualization of this extraordinary cache yet attempted volume i presents and translates the letters alongside a detailed line by line commentary while volume ii reconstructs the two seals that made the clay bullae that sealed the letters with special attention to aršāma s magnificent heirloom seal volume iii comprises a series of thematic essays which further explore the administrative economic military ideological religious and artistic environment to which aršāma and the letters belonged

sergey prokofiev 1891 1953 arguably the most popular composer of the twentieth century led a life of triumph and tragedy the story of his prodigious childhood in tsarist russia maturation in the west and rise and fall as a stalinist era composer is filled with unresolved questions sergey prokofiev and his world probes beneath the surface of his career and contextualizes his contributions to music on both sides of the nascent cold war divide the book contains previously unknown documents from the russian state archive of literature and art in moscow and the prokofiev estate in paris the literary notebook of the composer s mother mariya grigoryevna illuminates her involvement in his education and is translated in full as are ninety eight letters between the composer and his business partner levon atovmyan the collection also includes a translation of sigizmund krzhizhanovsky s unperformed stage adaptation of eugene onegin for which prokofiev composed incidental music in

1936 the essays in the book range in focus from musical sketches to kremlin decrees the contributors explore prokofiev s time in america evaluate his working methods in the mid 1930s document the creation of his score for the film lieutenant kizhe tackle how and why prokofiev rewrote his 1930 fourth symphony in 1947 detail his immortalization by soviet bureaucrats composers and scholars and examine prokofiev s interest in christian science and the paths it opened for his music the contributors are mark aranovsky kevin bartig elizabeth bergman leon botstein pamela davidson caryl emerson marina frolova walker nelly kravetz leonid maximenkov stephen press and peter schmelz

the writings of rav baruch shalom halevi ashlag rabash the firstborn son and successor of rav yehuda leib halevi ashlag baal hasulam author of the sulam ladder commentary on the book of zohar provide us with insights that connect the wisdom of kabbalah to our human experience these books disclose the profound knowledge of human nature that the rabash possessed and take us on a journey to our own souls as we absorb the texts we find that kabbalah is not some cryptic occultism but a time tested method to understand ourselves and improve our lives and the world around us

one of npr s great reads of 2018 an unforgettable portrait of one of the most inspiring historical figures of the twentieth century published on the centenary of his birth arrested in 1962 as south africa s apartheid regime intensified its brutal campaign against political opponents forty four year old lawyer and african national congress activist nelson mandela had no idea that he would spend the next twenty seven years in jail during his 10 052 days of incarceration the future leader of south africa wrote a multitude of letters to unyielding prison authorities fellow activists government officials and most memorably to his courageous wife winnie and his five children now 255 of these letters many of which have never been published provide exceptional insight into how mandela maintained his inner spirits while living in almost complete isolation and how he engaged with an outside world that became increasingly outraged by his plight organized chronologically and divided by the four venues in which he was held as a sentenced prisoner the prison letters of nelson mandela begins in pretoria local prison where mandela was held following his 1962 trial in 1964 mandela was taken to robben island prison where a stark existence was lightened only by visits and letters from family after eighteen years mandela was transferred to pollsmoor prison a large complex outside of cape town with beds and better food but where he and four of his comrades were confined to a rooftop cell

apart from the rest of the prison population finally mandela was taken to victor verster prison in 1988 where he was held until his release on february 11 1990 with accompanying facsimiles of some of his actual letters this landmark volume reveals how mandela a lawyer by training advocated for prisoners human rights it reveals him to be a loving father who wrote to his daughter i sometimes wish science could invent miracles and make my daughter get her missing birthday cards and have the pleasure of knowing that her pa loves her aware that photos and letters he sent had simply disappeared more painful still are the letters written in 1969 when mandela forbidden from attending the funerals of his mother and his son thembi was reduced to consoling family members through correspondence yet what emerges most powerfully is mandela s unfaltering optimism honour belongs to those who never forsake the truth even when things seem dark grim who try over and over again who are never discouraged by insults humiliation even defeat whether providing unwavering support to his also imprisoned wife or outlining a human rights philosophy that resonates today the prison letters of nelson mandela reveals the heroism of a man who refused to compromise his moral values in the face of extraordinary punishment ultimately these letters position mandela as one of the most inspiring figures of the twentieth century from the prison letters of nelson mandela a new world will be won not by those who stand at a distance with their arms folded but by those who are in the arena whose garments are torn by storms whose bodies are maimed in the course of contest i am convinced that floods of personal disaster can never drown a determined revolutionary nor can the cumulus of misery that accompanies tragedy suffocate him my respect for human beings is based not on the colour of a man s skin nor authority he may wield but purely on merit a good pen can also remind us of the happiest moments in our lives bring noble ideas into our dens our blood our souls it can turn tragedy into hope victory

it is sometimes easy to forget that the books of the bible are not really books at all but individual documents composed in a wide array of literary genres this clear concise and accessible text on the pauline letters orients beginning students to the genre in which paul writes the book compares and contrasts paul s letters with ancient and modern letters revealing the distinctive conventions forms and purposes of paul s epistles it focuses on the literary genre of the letter in ancient greece and rome providing an overview of subjects strategies and concerns of immediate relevance for readers who wish to understand paul in his ancient context discussion questions and sidebars are included

by the early eighteenth century the rapid expansion of the british empire had created a technological problem communication and networking became increasingly vital yet harder to maintain as colonial possessions and populations grew and more individuals moved around the globe britons both at home and abroad required a constant and reliable means of communication to conduct business plumb intellectual concerns discuss family matters run distant estates and exchange news as face to face communication became more intermittent men and women across the early modern british world relied on letters in the opened letter historian lindsay o neill explores the importance and impact of networking via letter writing among the members of the elite from england ireland and the colonies combining extensive archival research with social network digital technology the opened letter captures the dynamic associations that created a vibrant expansive and elaborate web of communication the author examined more than 10 000 letters produced by such figures as virginia planters william byrd i and his son william byrd ii the anglo irish

nobleman john perceval the newly minted duke of chandos james brydges and his wife cassandra brydges and sir hans sloane the president of the royal society and his colleague peter collinson she also mined letters from the likes of nicholas blundell a catholic member of the lancashire gentry and james eliot a london merchant and ardent quaker the opened letter reassembles and presents the vital individual and interlocking epistolary webs constructed by disparate groups of letter writers these early social networks illuminate the structural social and geographic workings of the british world as the nation was becoming a dominant global power

from the composer s lifetime to the present day gustav mahler s music has provoked extreme responses from the public and from experts poised between the romantic tradition he radically renewed and the austere modernism whose exponents he inspired mahler was a consummate public persona and yet an impassioned artist who withdrew to his lakeside hut where he composed his vast symphonies and intimate song cycles his advocates have produced countless studies of the composer s life and work but they have focused on analysis internal to the compositions along with their programmatic contexts in this volume musicologists and historians turn outward to examine the broader political social and literary changes reflected in mahler s music peter franklin takes up questions of gender talia pecker berio examines the composer s jewish identity and thomas peattie charles s maier and karen painter consider respectively contemporary theories of memory the theatricality of mahler s art and fin de siècle politics and the impinging confrontation with mass society the private world of gustav mahler in his songs and late works is explored by leading austrian musicologist peter revers and a german counterpart camilla bork and by the american mahler expert stephen hefling mahler s symphonies challenged europeans and americans to experience music in new ways before his decision to move to the united states the composer knew of the enthusiastic response from america s urban musical audiences mahler and his world reproduces reviews of these early performances for the first time edited by zoë lang the mahler controversy that polarized austrians and germans also unfolds through a series of documents heretofore unavailable in english edited by painter and bettina varwig and the terms of the debate are examined by leon botstein in the context of the late twentieth century mahler revival

a new look at one of the most important composers of the twentieth century stravinsky and his world brings together an international roster of scholars to explore fresh perspectives on the life and music of igor stravinsky situating stravinsky in new intellectual and musical contexts the essays in this volume shed valuable light on one

of the most important composers of the twentieth century contributors examine stravinsky s interaction with spanish and latin american modernism rethink the stylistic label neoclassicism with a section on the ideological conflict over his lesser known opera buffa mavra and reassess his connections to his homeland paying special attention to stravinsky s visit to the soviet union in 1962 the essays also explore stravinsky s musical and religious differences with arthur lourié delve into stravinsky s collaboration with pyotr suvchinsky and roland manuel in the genesis of his groundbreaking poetics of music and look at how the movement within stasis evident in the scores of stravinsky s orpheus and oedipus rex reflected the composer s fierce belief in fate rare documents including spanish and mexican interviews russian letters articles by arthur lourié and rarely seen french and russian texts supplement the volume bringing to life stravinsky s rich intellectual milieu and intense personal relationships the contributors are tatiana baranova leon botstein jonathan cross valérie dufour gretchen horlacher tamara levitz klára mórícz leonora saavedra and svetlana savenko

bizet s carmen is probably the best known opera of the standard repertoire yet its very familiarity often prevents us from approaching it with the seriousness it deserves this handbook explores the opera in a number of contexts bringing to the surface the controversies over gender race class and musical propriety that greeted its premiere and that have been rekindled by the recent spate of film versions beginning with a study of the mérimée story by peter robinson and an examination of the social tensions in nineteenth century france that inform both that story and the opera the book traces the latter through its genesis and reception the central core of the book presents a close reading of the opera that offers new interpretive possibilities the handbook concludes with discussions of four films based on the opera carmen jones and the versions of carmen by carlos saura peter brook and francesco rosi the volume contains a bibliography music examples and a synopsis

the letters of the apostle paul are central witnesses to the christian faith and to the earliest history of christianity and yet when students preachers and others turn to paul they find many things hard to understand 2 peter 3 16 in these ancient writings james prothro s new book aims to help readers see the apostle s faith and hope at work as he evangelized the nations steeped in up to date scholarship and a passion for the gospel paul preached prothro draws readers into paul s life and letters in order to help them hear the apostle s voice the book s chapters offer introductions to paul s background life and legacy an introduction to ancient letter writing a guide

to understanding paul's theology across the letters a survey of the portrait of paul in the book of acts separate treatments of each letter's background and purpose treatments of key theological topics in each letter and a thorough outline of each letter showing its arguments and how they make sense prothro introduces complex matters with clarity balance and an inviting style he not only offers answers but models how to ask questions helping us reason through paul's letters as ancient documents and as christian scripture this book will prove a valuable introduction for those who study teach and preach these biblical books

this volume covers boswell's emotionally eventful youthful travels through the german and swiss territories from mid june 1764 after his law studies in utrecht to new year's day 1765 when he crossed the alps for the next stages of his european tour in italy corsica and france

in sefer yeşirah and its contexts tzahi weiss explores anew the contested history of sefer yeşirah in the process extending our knowledge of jewish intellectual traditions excluded from rabbinic canon

in looking closely at horace walpole's correspondence george e haggerty shows how these letters when taken in aggregate offer an astonishingly vivid account of the vagaries of eighteenth century masculinity walpole talks about himself obsessively his wants his needs his desires his physical and mental pain his artistic appreciation and his critical responses it is impossible to read these letters and not come away with a vivid impression of a complex personality from another age haggerty examines the ways in which walpole presents himself as an eighteenth century gentleman and considers his personal relationships his needs and aspirations his emotionalism and his rationality in short his construction of himself in order to see what it tells us about the age in general and more specifically about masculinity in an era of social flux this study of walpole and his epistolary relations offers a unique window into both the history of masculinity in the eighteenth century and the codification of friendship as the preeminent value in western culture recent studies have tried to rewrite walpole in a twenty first century mold while this work looks at the writer and the ways in which he constructs himself and his relations not in hopes of uncovering a lurid secret but rather in pursuit of the figure that he created and that has fascinated generations of readers and writers since the eighteenth century
