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a companion to literature in film provides state of the art research on world literature film and the complex theoretical relationship between them 25 essays by international experts cover the most important topics in the study of literature and film adaptations covers a wide variety of topics including cultural thematic theoretical and genre issues discusses film adaptations from the birth of cinema to the present day explores a diverse range of titles and genres including film noir biblical epics and italian and chinese cinema

narratives of place link people and geographic location with a cultural imaginary

through literature and visual narration contemporary literature and film often frame narratives with specific geographic locations which saturate the narrative with cultural meanings in relation to natural and man made landscapes this interdisciplinary collection seeks to interrogate such connections to probe how place is narrativized in literature and film utilizing close readings of specific filmic and literary texts all chapters serve to tease out cultural and historical meanings in respect of human engagement with landscapes always mindful of national cultural and topographical specificity the book is structured around five core themes contested histories of place environmental landscapes cityscapes the social construction of place and landscapes of belonging

the four volumes of film study include a fresh approach to each of the basic categories in the original edition volume one examines the film as film volume two focuses on the thematic approach to film volume three draws on the history of film and volume four contains extensive appendices listing film distributors sources and historical information as well as an index of authors titles and film personalities

for most people film adaptation of literature can be summed up in one sentence the movie wasn't as good as the book this volume undertakes to show the reader that not only is this evaluation not always true but sometimes it is intrinsically unfair movies based on literary works while often billed as adaptations are more correctly termed translations a director and his actors translate the story from the written page into a visual presentation depending on the form of the original text and the chosen method of translation certain inherent difficulties and pitfalls are associated with this change of medium so often our reception of a book based movie has more to do with our expectations and reading of the literature than with the job that the movie production did or did not do avoiding these biases and fairly evaluating any particular literary based film takes an awareness of certain factors written with a formalistic rather than historical approach this work presents a comprehensive guide to literature based films establishing a contextual and theoretical basis to help the reader understand the relationships between such movies and the original texts as well as the reader's own individual responses to these productions to this end it focuses on recognizing and appreciating the inherent difficulties encountered when basing a film on a literary work be it a novel novella play or short story individual chapters deal with the specific issues and difficulties raised by each of these genres providing an overview backed up by case studies of specific film translations films and literary works receiving this treatment include the unbearable lightness of being the manchurian candidate 1962 lady windermere's fan by oscar wilde and shakespeare's henry v interspersed

throughout the text are suggestions for activities the film student or buff can use to enhance his or her appreciation and understanding of the films instructors considering this book for use in a course may request an examination copy here

examining film literature and art produced during and after the malayan emergency the guerrilla war fought between the malayan national liberation army and the military forces of the british commonwealth this collection demonstrates how art functions as a record of cultural memory that both reinforces and challenges official histories beyond that it also brings new understandings of the malayan emergency itself and malaysias subsequent development as a postcolonial nation the first section of the book focuses on films and writings produced during the period of the emergency to capture the socio political circumstances of the time and understand its effect on the people the second section goes on to explore representations of the emergency generated after the event highlighting how it was reimagined or reevaluated by later artists and what ideological ends they served offering a comparative methodological approach it investigates works that account for a range of perspectives including british communist and malayan malaysian bringing together the personal and political within individual and collective histories this collection offers a new understanding of how the emergency contributed to the formation of postcolonial malaysia and demonstrates the central role that film literature and art play in the creation of cultural memory

this introduction to chinese national cinema covers three chinas mainland china hong kong and taiwan historical and comparative perspectives bring out the parallel developments in these three chinas while critical analysis explores thematic and stylistic changes over time as well as exploring artistic achievements and ideological debates yingjin zhang examines how despite the pressures placed on the industry from state control and rigid censorship chinese national cinema remains incapable of projecting a single unified picture but rather portrays many different chinas

since 1986 chinese film circles have turned from their study of chinese film in terms of aesthetics and have begun to explore film in terms of ideological political and cultural concerns in particular this concern has centered on matters of the marketplace with much debate between film scholars and filmmakers over the qualities of entertainment film in contemporary china draws together the first english translations of recent articles written by the most respected critics theorists and filmmakers in china who discuss this significant new direction parts one and two discuss the ideological problems now facing chinese film scholars and filmmakers focusing on the

fifth generation filmmakers whose works brought chinese filmmaking to international prominence part three is a critical study of the relationship of traditional culture to contemporary aesthetics the fourth part follows the theoretical and critical debate over the entertainment film which forms the basis for the third movement of chinese film during the new era the fifth part concerns the ongoing debate over the values of film theory in relationship to filmmaking and the final section summarizes developments in film scholarship following the events in tiananmen square in 1989 film in contemporary china is designed primarily for film scholars especially those concerned with china with international film more generally and with the relationship between film and society

this ambitious undertaking is designed to acquaint students teachers and researchers with reference sources in any branch of english studies which marcuse defines as all those subjects and lines of critical and scholarly inquiry presently pursued by members of university departments of english language and literature within each of 24 major sections marcuse lists and annotates bibliographies guides reviews of research encyclopedias dictionaries journals and reference histories the annotations and various indexes are models of clarity and usefulness and cross references are liberally supplied where appropriate although cost conscious librarians will probably consider the several other excellent literary bibliographies in print such as james l harner s literary research guide modern language assn of america 1989 larger academic libraries will want marcuse s volume jack bales mary washington coll lib fredericksburg va library journal

since 1949 chinese film has been greatly influenced by a variety of historical cultural and political events in the history of the people s republic of china this volume explores the development of chinese film from 1949 to 1976 this volume restores chinese film to its original historical form and assesses its complex relationship with society politics culture and art in the maoist period the 17 year films cultural revolution era films the influence of model operas and the documentary newsreels of xinwen jianbao are discussed combining a macro perspective with a micro perspective the author analyzes the special characteristics of chinese film in this period and showcases the inheritance and differences between earlier chinese film and chinese film in the newly founded the people s republic of china the book will be essential reading for scholars and students in film studies chinese studies cultural studies and media studies helping readers develop a comprehensive understanding of chinese film

this book explores italian science fiction from 1861 the year of italy s unification to the present day focusing on how this genre helped shape notions of otherness and normalness in particular italian science fiction draws upon critical race studies postcolonial theory and feminist studies to explore how migration colonialism multiculturalism and racism have been represented in genre film and literature topics include the role of science fiction in constructing a national identity the representation and self representation of alien immigrants in italy the creation of internal others such as southerners and roma the intersections of gender and race discrimination and italian science fiction s transnational dialogue with foreign science fiction this book reveals that though it is arguably a minor genre in italy science fiction offers an innovative interpretive angle for rethinking italian history and imagining future change in italian society

a 2024 choice outstanding academic title this book tells the story of german language literature on film beginning with pioneering motion picture adaptations of faust in 1897 and early debates focused on high art as mass culture it explores analyzes and contextualizes the so called golden age of silent cinema in the 1920s the impact of sound on adaptation practices the abuse of literary heritage by nazi filmmakers and traces the role of german language literature in exile and postwar films across ideological boundaries in divided germany in new german cinema and in remakes and movies for cinema as well as television and streaming services in the 21st century having provided the narrative core to thousands of films since the late 19th century many of german cinema s most influential masterpieces were inspired by canonical texts popular plays and even children s literature not being restricted to german adaptations however this book also traces the role of literature originally written in german in international film productions which sheds light on the interrelation between cinema and key historical events it outlines how processes of adaptation are

shaped by global catastrophes and the emergence of nations by materialist conditions liberal economies and capitalist imperatives political agendas the mobility of individuals and sometimes by the desire to create reflective surfaces and perhaps even art commercial cinema s adaptation practices have foregrounded economic interest but numerous filmmakers throughout cinema history have turned to german language literature not simply to entertain but as a creative contribution to the public sphere marking adaptation practice at least potentially as a form of active citizenship

drawing the boundaries of art the changing opportunity space developments in the wider social context change from within new production and consumption practices the intellectualization of film mechanisms for a cultural valuation

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
