the editors of emerging international issues in student affairs research and practice situate developing issues in student affairs through research new and emergent methodologies pedagogies and practices the text aims to encourage intercultural perspectives and opportunities across student affairs research and practice while calling upon international student affairs practitioners faculty and staff to engage in international evidence based research that provides a foundation toward a collective consensus of the field to accomplish these goals the editors invited predominant practitioners in student affairs practice and student affairs scholars from across the globe to engage in discourse share their insights and offer implications to the student affairs profession at the international level the editors do this by

expectation that good managers can predict the outcomes of their efforts and can and should exercise control over the inputs however to be effective leaders they must be able to perceive new possibilities beyond those structures and expectations how can they do both rethinking student affairs practice offers an answer to that question love and estanek challenge their readers to perceive their responsibilities institutions and relationships through multiple lenses they have developed a model for change based in four concepts that will help their readers do this the four concepts are valuing dualisms transcending paradigms recognizing connectedness and embracing paradox

student affairs by the numbers aims to be the go to book for student affairs professionals who want to know the basics of quantitative research and statistics for their work books on assessment in student affairs tend to discuss processes more than research design and statistics most books on statistics share too much information for practitioners overwhelming them and making it difficult to discern what they need to know since these books do not use examples from student affairs it is even more difficult for practitioners to connect with new concepts student affairs professionals need to know how to design a study collect data analyze data interpret results and present the results in an understandable manner this book will begin by establishing the need for these skills in student affairs and then quickly move to how to develop a research culture how to conduct research how to understand statistics and concluding with how to change our research assessment behaviors in order to make higher education better for students

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
