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the study of language acquisition has become a center of scientific inquiry into the nature of the human mind the result is a windfall of new information about language about learning and about children themselves in language acquisition jill and peter de villiers provide a lively introduction to this fast growing field their book deals centrally with the way the child acquires the sounds meanings and syntax of his language and the way he learns to use his language to communicate with others in discussing these issues the de villiers provide a clear and insightful treatment of the classic questions about language acquisition does the child show a genetic predisposition for speech or grammar or semantics which makes him uniquely able to learn human language what kinds of learning are involved in acquiring language and what kinds of experience with a language are necessary to support such learning is there a critical period during the child s development which is optimal for language acquisition and what kind of psychological disabilities underlie the failure to acquire language

this major textbook setting new standards of clarity and comprehensiveness will be welcomed by all serious students of first language acquisition written from a linguistic perspective it provides detailed accounts of the development of children s receptive and productive abilities in all the core areas of language phonology morphology syntax and semantics with a critical acuity drawn from long experience and without attempting to offer a survey of all the huge mass of child language literature david ingram directs students to the fundamental studies and sets these in broad perspective students are thereby introduced to the history of the field and the current state of our knowledge in respect of three main themes method description and explanation whilst the descriptive facts that are currently available on first language acquisition are central to the book its emphasis on methodology and explanation gives it a particular distinction the various ways in which

research is conducted is discussed in detail as well as the strengths and weaknesses of various approaches leading to new perspectives on key theoretical issues first language acquisition provides advanced undergraduate and graduate students alike with a cogent and closely analysed exposition of how children acquire language in real time equally importantly readers will have acquired the fundamental knowledge and skill not only to interpret primary literature but also to approach their own research with sophistication

this text is an up to date introduction to language acquisition designed to meet the needs of advanced undergraduates and beginning graduate students in linguistics and cognitive science it is the first language acquisition text to be written from the perspective of recent theoretical linguistics and uses chomskyan generative grammar as a framework for description taking models and analyses from generative phonology morphology syntax and semantics professor goodluck describes children s language acquisition using examples from a variety of languages further chapters take up central questions concerning cognitive mechanisms by which children process language and form rules the nature of the input to the language learner and the relation between language development and other aspects of cognitive development the book is extensively illustrated with models and figures and each chapter is followed by questions for discussion and suggestions for further reading it also includes a full bibliography

the second edition of theories in second language acquisition seeks to build on the strengths of the first edition by surveying the major theories currently used in second language acquisition research this volume is an ideal introductory text for undergraduate and graduate students in sla and language teaching each chapter focuses on a single theory written by a leading scholar in the field in an easy to follow style a basic foundational description of the theory relevant data or research models used with this theory common misunderstandings and a sample study from the field to show the theory in practice this text is designed to provide a consistent and coherent presentation for those new to the field who seek basic understanding of theories that underlie contemporary sla research researchers will also find the book useful as a quick guide to theoretical work outside their respective domains

this volume presents recent generative research on the nature of grammars of child second language l2 acquirers a learner population whose exposure to an l2 occurs between the ages of 4 to 8 the main goal is to define child l2 acquisition in relation to other types of acquisition such as child monolingual and bilingual acquisition adult l2 acquisition and specific language impairment this comparative perspective opens up new angles for the discussion of currently debated issues such as the role of universal grammar in constraining development developmental sequences in l2 maturational influences on the growth of grammar critical period effects for different linguistic domains initial state and ultimate attainment in relation to length of exposure and l1 transfer in relation to age of onset these issues are explored using longitudinal cross sectional and experimental data from l2 children acquiring a range of languages including dutch english french and greek

this book is written in order to help undergraduate students and trainee teachers to reflect on certain topics and key issues related to second language acquisition despite the proliferation of books and introductory courses in second language acquisition most of these books very often provide a very complex account of theoretical views in second language acquisition and sometimes fail to emphasise the crucial interplay between how people learn languages and what is the most effective way to teach languages the overall purpose of this book is to provide an overview of second language acquisition research and theories by identifying the main key issues in this field and by highlighting the relevance of this research for classroom implications the study of second language acquisition is a rich and varied enterprise carried out by researchers whose interests and training often lie in broader disciplines of linguistics psychology sociology and education readers will be encouraged to critically reflect on the presented content through self engaging thinking activities in the form of questions matching activities choices and conclusions about the implications of sla theories to the real world applications
