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*affectivity is essential in language learning and new ways of studying it must be considered in this volume the authors bring together two particularly relevant aspects of affectivity that are rarely related the prosody of speech as the physical manifestation of affectivity and affectivity involved in the learning process with a strong component of inter culture and identity in sum overly narrow perspectives on affective language can only be avoided if we continue to bring together scientific and didactic studies of affectivity as a broad and diverse whole*

*this volume explores the elusive subject of english prosody the stress rhythm and intonation of the language and its relevance for english language teaching its sharp focus will be especially welcomed by teachers of english to non native speakers but also by scholars and researchers interested in applied linguistics the book examines key issues in the development of prosody and delves into the role of intonation in the construction of meaning the contributions tackle difficult areas of intonation for language learners providing a theoretical analysis of each stumbling block as well as a practical explanation for teachers and teacher trainers the numerous issues dealt with in the book include stress and rhythm tone units and information structure intonation and pragmatic meaning tonicity and markedness etc the authors have deployed speech analysis software to illustrate their examples as well as to encourage readers to carry out their own computerized prosodic analyses*

*first published in 2002 this volume is part of the outstanding dissertations in linguistics series this book investigates the processing of ellipsis sentences focusing on the following questions i are ellipsis sentences processed using special routines employed only for ellipsis or are they processed using the same principles needed for unelided sentences ii does parallelism influence sentence processing if so what kinds of similarities matter*

*the essays in this volume are all original contributions dealing in one way or another with the analysis of prosody primarily intonation and rhythm and the role it plays in everyday conversation they take as their methodological starting point the contention that the study of prosody must begin with genuine interactional rather than pre fabricated laboratory data through close empirical analysis of recorded material from genuine english german and italian conversations the prosody emerges here as a strategy deployed by interactants in the management of turn taking and floor holding in the negotiation of conversational activities such as repair assessments announcements reproaches and news receipts and in the keying of the tone or modality of interactional sequences*

non linguistic information in speech synthesis and prosody control in speech synthesis including prosody conversions a high level of quality has already been achieved in speech synthesis by using selection based methods with segments of human speech although the method enables synthetic speech with various voice qualities and speaking styles it requires large speech corpora with targeted quality and style accordingly speech conversion techniques are now of growing interest among researchers hmm gmm based methods are widely used but entail several major problems when viewed from the prosody perspective prosodic features cover a wider time span than segmental features and their frame by frame processing is not always appropriate the book offers a good overview of state of the art studies on prosody in speech synthesis

this study is a systematic investigation of the links among prosody clause structure and discourse pragmatics in four oral narratives of tarifta a vso berber language spoken in northeastern morocco it is a new method of empirical analysis of language utilizing a unique combination of sound analysis statistics grammar and story structure using the speech analysis program signalize levels of amplitude fundamental frequency length and speed were analyzed in addition factors relating to clause structure and discourse pragmatics were quantified the results of this investigation support some but not all claims of previous researchers and reveal numerous additional interrelations not previously noted these results suggest that prosody in relation to discourse pragmatics and clause structure may be a rich field of future linguistic endeavor they also contribute to greater knowledge of a little known language in north africa

prosody is constitutive for spoken interaction in more than 25 years its study has grown into a full fledged and very productive field with a sound catalogue of research methods and principles this volume presents the state of the art illustrates current research trends and uncovers potential directions for future research it will therefore be of major interest to everyone studying spoken interaction the collection brings together an impressive range of internationally renowned scholars from different yet closely related and compatible research traditions which have made a significant contribution to the field they cover issues such as the units of language the contextualization of actions and activities conversational modalities and genres the display of affect and emotion the multimodality of interaction language acquisition and aphasia all contributions are based on empirical audio and or video recorded data of natural talk in interaction including languages such as english german and japanese the methodologies employed come from ethnomethodology conversation analysis and interactional linguistics

the papers in this special issue reflect an increase in research interest in the use of intonation and prosody in the processing of spoken sentences as more is learned about sentence processing and as increased attention is paid to the processing of the spoken language so researchers have begun to ask questions about the organizational principles of the spoken form this book covers a range of such questions of interest both to linguists and to psycholinguists it considers aspects of the linguistics characterization of prosody such as whether prosodic structures are themselves often ambiguous and in need of parsing it also includes studies of the use of prosody in the structural interpretation of sentences involving the relationship between intonational focus and sentence structure the role of prosody in structural disambiguation and the predictive use of prosody in determining the length of the current utterance papers in the collection also consider the role of prosody in the early acquisition of grammar the lateralization of prosody in the brain and the extent to which prosody can be claimed to guide rather than support syntactic structural analysis

this volume brings together new work on prosody and prosodic interfaces from international experts in the field the book is divided into three parts that explore topics in word prosody and phrase prosody lexical tone and intonation and the syntax prosody interface while many recent studies have focused on prosody and related questions a significant number of languages dialects and varieties remain largely undocumented or understudied in this respect the chapters in this volume help to fill this empirical gap with investigations into languages such as choguita rar[?] muri mexico poko papua new guinea rere sudan and uspanteko guatemala alongside more widely studied languages such as japanese and serbian the authors also address a range of important questions pertaining to for example the interactions between lexical and postlexical tones and the relationship between prosodic and syntactic structure the volume as a whole sheds light on how prosody is structured in language and how it functions in human communication

this book is a comprehensive yet succinct overview of research on prosodic development uniting phonetic phonological and clinical approaches to the topic it brings together diverse research findings on prosodic perception prosodic production the development of prosodic structure and prosodic disorders in clinical populations the book is written for advanced undergraduate students graduate students as well as for professionals and scholars working in linguistics child language development psychology or related disciplines it also introduces the reader to important related themes in speech perception research such as prosodic bootstrapping and word segmentation included in this first part is a discussion of the production of prosody during the pre linguistic and early linguistic periods with a focus on central topics such as ambient language effects and differentiation of prosody according to pragmatic function in this part is where the discussion of the development of individual prosodic systems such as stress timing intonation and tone are discussed this book also deals with clinical aspects of prosody such as the assessment of prosody and atypical prosody in clinical conditions such as autistic spectrum disorder childhood apraxia of speech specific language impairment and hearing impairment the book s cross linguistic approach is documented through numerous examples and illustrations chapter summaries relevant sidebar topics and a list of key terms make the book highly readable and accessible

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
