early church faced with the need to provide for people who had left their kin to devote themselves to the life of the church regulated the rules of marriage so that wealth could be channelled away from the family and into the church thus the church became an interitor acquiring vast tracts of property through the alienation of familial rights at the same time the structure of domestic life was changed dramatically the church placing more emphasis on individual wishes on conjugality and on spiritual rather than natural kinship tracing the consequences of this change through to the present day jack goody challenges some fundamental assumptions about the making of western society and provides an alternative focus for future study of the european family kinship structures and marriage patterns the questions he raises will provoke much interest and discussion amongst anthropologists sociologists and historians
