discusses and highlights portfolios as an alternative assessment practice in the classroom what to put in portfolios how to evaluate and manage them

in teaching lives wendy bishop gathers twenty three of her own critical essays from diverse sources and sets them in the context of her current thinking about composition and teaching individually these essays address a range of critical and pedagogical issues in the teaching of writing as a collection they represent bishop s best work and make a coherent accessible statement from a prominent scholar at mid career this portable bishop then will give readers in one volume what has been unique about bishop s prolific contribution to composition studies since the mid 1980s pedagogically process and response oriented she advocates invention based exploratory writing for students at all levels as a researcher her approach is ethnographic and in her work with new teachers she encourages self study teacher research and reflection as a means toward an informed professional stance teaching lives combines her interest in composition literature research and creative writing and explores the connections among them above all throughout this important work bishop affirms and celebrates teaching the teacher s life and living a life in teaching

this collection of 17 papers provides a blueprint for teachers who want increasingly sophisticated methods for monitoring student growth and can serve as a resource for in service educators as literacy instruction changes papers in the first section of the book
