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the routledge handbook of translation and religion is the first to bring together an extensive interdisciplinary engagement with the multiple ways in which the concepts and practices of translation and religion intersect the book engages a number of scholarly disciplines in conversation with each other including the study of translation and interpreting religion philosophy anthropology history art history and area studies a range of leading and emerging international specialists critically engage with changing understandings of the key categories translation and religion as discursive constructs thus contributing to the development of a new field of academic study translation and religion the 28 contributions divided into six parts analyze how translation constructs ideas texts or objects as sacred or for religious purposes often in competition with what is categorized as non religious the part played by faith communities is treated as integral to analyses of the role of translation and religion it investigates how or why translation functions in re constructing and transforming religion s and for whom and examines a range of sacred texts in translation from the written to the spoken manuscript to print paper to digital architectural form to objects of sacred art intersemiotic scriptural texts and where commentary exegesis and translation interweave this handbook is an indispensable scholarly resource for researchers in translation studies and the study of religions

this book presents a critical reading of kristapurāṇa the first south asian retelling of the bible in 1579 thomas stephens 1549 1619 a young jesuit priest arrived in goa with the aim of preaching christianity to the local subjects of the portuguese colony kristapurāṇa 1616 a sweeping narrative with 10 962 verses is his epic poetic retelling of the christian bible in the marathi language this fascinating text which first appeared in roman script is also one of the earliest printed works in the subcontinent kristapurāṇa translated the entire biblical narrative into marathi a century before bible translation into south asian languages began in earnest in protestant missions this book contributes to an understanding of translation as it was practiced in south asia through its study of genre

landscapes and cultural translation in kristapurāṇa while also retelling a history of sacred texts and biblical narratives in the region it examines this understudied masterpiece of christian writing from goa in the early era of catholic missions and examines themes such as the complexities of the colonial machinery religious encounters textual traditions and multilingualism providing insight into portuguese goa of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries the first of its kind the book makes significant interventions into the current discourse on cultural translation and brings to the fore a hitherto understudied text it will be an indispensable resource for students and researchers of translation studies comparative literature religious studies biblical studies english literature cultural studies literary history postcolonial studies and south asian studies

this volume seeks to foreground a borderless history and geography of south southeast and east asian littoral zones that would be maritime focused and thereby explore the ancient connections and dynamics of interaction that favoured the encounters among the cultures found throughout the region stretching from the indian ocean littorals to the western pacific from the early historical period to the present transcending the artificial boundaries of macro regions and nation states and trying to bridge the arbitrary divide between inherently cosmopolitan high cultures e g sanskritic sinitic or islamicate and local or indigenous cultures this multidisciplinary volume explores the metaphor of monsoon asia as a vast geo environmental area inhabited by speakers of numerous language phyla which for millennia has formed an integrated system of littorals where crops goods ideas cosmologies and ritual practices circulated on the sea routes governed by the seasonal monsoon winds the collective body of work presented in the volume describes monsoon asia as an ideal theatre for circulatory dynamics of cultural transfer interaction acceptance selection and avoidance and argues that despite the rich ethnic linguistic and sociocultural diversity a shared pattern of values norms and cultural models is discernible throughout the region

this typological survey and analysis of co compounds considers topics such as the notion of word markedness the syntax and semantics of coordination grammaticalization and lexical semantics and draws on the author s original research on a wide range of languages

the oxford handbook of derivational morphology is intended as a companion volume to the oxford handbook of compounding oup 2009 aiming to provide a comprehensive and thorough overview of the study of derivational morphology written by distinguished scholars its 41 chapters are devoted to theoretical and definitional matters formal and semantic issues interdisciplinary connections and detailed descriptions of derivational processes in a wide range of language families it presents the reader with the current state of the art in the study of derivational morphology the handbook begins with an overview and a consideration of definitional matters distinguishing derivation from inflection on the one hand and compounding on the other from a formal perspective the handbook treats affixation prefixation suffixation infixation circumfixation etc conversion reduplication root and pattern and other templatic processes as well as prosodic and subtractive means of forming new words from a semantic perspective it looks at the processes that form various types of adjectives adverbs nouns and verbs as well as evaluatives and the rarer processes that form function words chapters are devoted to issues of theory methodology the historical development of derivation and to child language acquisition sociolinguistic experimental and psycholinguistic approaches the second half of the book surveys derivation in fifteen language families that are widely dispersed in terms of both geographical location and typological characteristics it ends with a consideration of both areal tendencies in derivation and the issue of universals
