head start is a federal program that has provided comprehensive early childhood development services to low income children since 1996 services provided to preschool aged children include child development educational health nutritional social and other activities intended to prepare low income children for entering kindergarten the program is administered by the administration for children and families of the department of health and human services hhs unlike many other social service programs federal head start funds are provided directly to local grantees rather than through states programs are locally designed and are administered by a network of about 1 500 public and private nonprofit agencies outlines the past present and future of this socially beneficial program the long term impact on the children aided particularly with respect to educational attainment is addressed and continues to be an area of focus and concern in addition the numerous roadblocks that exist with regard to the head start program are assessed and handled accordingly contents preface head start background and funding alice butler and melinda gish head start issues in the 108th congress alice butler and melinda gish head start better data and processes needed to monitor underenrollment marnie s shaul bibliography index

currently enrolling approximately 900 000 poor children each year head start has served 25 million children and their families since it was established 44 years ago presidents and policymakers have embraced and scorned it at times scientists have misguided it and the media has misunderstood it despite its longevity and renown much of head start s story has never been disclosed to the general public the hidden history of head start is a detailed account of this remarkable program surveying projects that were forerunners of head start its birth during the johnson administration its fate during the presidency of george w bush and the many years between as well as what the future may hold in store for head start edward zigler and sally styfco offer an inside view of the program s decades of service detailing the ever changing waves of politics ideology science media interest and public mood that oftentimes threatened the program s very existence providing a balanced assessment of head start s effectiveness which has been a matter of debate since its inception the authors also strive to answer

questions that continue to pervade discussions about the program and its future for example why is head start a leader of early childhood services still struggling to prove itself why does it serve such a narrow segment of the population and how can head start continue its mission as universal preschool becomes a reality the hidden history of head start will be of great importance to those who shape head start's future and to those who wish to develop research and implement new early childhood programs students historians and scholars in the fields of early intervention and developmental science as well as policymakers will find here an invaluable resource as well as a fascinating chronicle of one of the foremost social programs in us history

often referred to as a laboratory from which the general early childhood education community can learn head start has benefited from more than 45 years of experience its unique blend of early childhood practices assessments and monitoring along with a social service style approach contribute to head start standing out as a premiere early childhood program this book is designed to be a teaching tool for workshops and courses as well as an on site resource for current and future head start teaching staff and others in early childhood education by presenting background information vignettes research and classroom activities this book on school readiness combines best practices in early childhood education with relevant applications topics written by experts in their fields include approaches to learning and teaching strategies assessments behavior management classroom set up curriculum and lesson plans early language literacy math science social studies and creative arts physical health and development gross and fine motor skills social and emotional development teaching young children with disabilities and dual language learners tips for involving parents in their children's education

this report presents a revision of the head start child outcomes framework 2000 renamed the head start child development and learning framework promoting positive outcomes in early childhood programs serving children 3 5 years old the framework outlines the essential areas of development and learning that are to be used by head start programs to establish school readiness goals for their children monitor children's progress align curricula and conduct program planning it can be used to guide curriculum implementation and assessment to plan teaching and learning experiences that align to school readiness goals and track children's progress across developmental domains the framework is organized into 11 domains 37 domain elements and over 100 examples the domains and domain elements are organized in a similar way to the original framework to facilitate a transition to the revised one the changes to the revised framework are designed to provide more clarity to the domains and domain elements of the original framework and do not create new requirements for head start grantees the early childhood field has changed dramatically the population of children served by head start and other early childhood programs continues to grow more diverse

new research has improved the office of head start's understanding of school readiness and the Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007 has increased the framework's role in head start programs in addition almost every state now has early learning standards also new reporting systems have emerged at the state level and through the office of special education programs OSEP within the U.S. Department of Education the framework is revised in light of these realities this report was prepared by the head start resource center

In this book the editors hope to present you with the latest research and thinking to help you better appreciate the complex interactions that characterize human development in infancy and childhood they have placed emphasis on important contemporary issues and challenges exploring topics such as understanding development in the context of current societal and cultural influences attention is given to articles that also discuss effective practical applications the editors hope that this anthology will serve as a catalyst to help students become more effective future professionals and parents

On its 30th anniversary public acceptance of head start is high yet understanding of its goals is low and evaluation research is limited in quality and scope in this book a roundtable of representatives from government universities medicine and family support agencies identifies a set of research possibilities to generate a broader understanding of the effects of head start on families and children among the important issues discussed are the ethnic and linguistic diversity of head start families the social conditions of the community context and the implications of the changing economic landscape for both families and head start itself
