this is a collection of pugh s best work from her four previous books as well as many new poems including the prize winning m s a and intercity lullaby reprint first published in 1990

in this her twelfth collection noted poet sheenagh pugh steps into a new northern landscape the shetland islands with poems steeped in the wilder weathers and views of rugged coastlines sweeping sea vistas and the hardy historical characters who have inhabited these lands a lovely pared down spareness and an elegaic quality informing this new work the author s characteristic dry humour is also present she is a poet who considers too accessible to be the best sort of compliment sheenagh pugh s work has as much to offer the general reader as it does the specialist who will admire her artful use of traditional forms

afternoons go nowhere is poet sheenagh pugh s tenth collection an acute understanding of the human condition enlivens these poems the foibles of historical kings queens and commoners are exposed to her sharply scrutinising eye there is a notable sequence of poems about canadian provinces as well as work inspired by her home in shetland

elisions displacements journeys memories of journeys dreams this collection of poems by

sheenagh pugh has a pervasive elegiac quality known for her incisive narratives many of these new poems work more by implication than explication

set in a country lying somewhere between wales and central asia in a time which might be the middle ages or the near present folk music is a rounded and satisfying portrayal of a small rural community its loves and its conflicts and the tensions which threaten its cohesion central to the story is the convention that on marriage a woman does not speak to anyone except in private to her husband until the birth of her first child through a subtly entwined narrative which tells the tale from a variety of perspectives pugh crafts a story at once tender and thought provoking forcing the reader to confront the prejudices and preconceptions of contemporary sophistication this is a novel of rare depth power and ambiguity its central metaphor reaching beyond the lives of its characters parallelling our modern dilemma does the abandonment of tradition leave us only with rootlessness and dislocation sheenagh pugh is known to thousands of poetry readers for sometimes her much anthologised poem on the underground and for her selected poems a set text in schools she currently lectures in creative writing at the university of glamorgan and has won numerous prizes for her work including the babel prize for translation and the acw book of the year in 2000
