game theory has revolutionized the study of animal behavior the fundamental principle of evolutionary game theory that the strategy adopted by one individual depends on the strategies exhibited by others has proven a powerful tool in uncovering the forces shaping otherwise mysterious behaviors in this volume the first since 1982 devoted to evolutionary game theory leading researchers describe applications of the theory to diverse types of behavior providing an overview of recent discoveries and a synthesis of current research the volume begins with a clear introduction to game theory a

the purpose of this thesis is to evaluate the relationship between a specific dimension of collective identity importance to identity and intergroup discrimination three sets of studies explored this association the first set studies 1a 1d assessed whether emphasising vs de emphasising the intergroup context affected the relationship between importance to identity and intergroup discrimination findings from studies 1a 1d revealed a significant positive relationship between importance to identity and intergroup discrimination when intergroup relations were emphasised no such association was found when intergroup relations were de emphasised when the intergroup context was emphasised new zealanders whose national identity was important to them showed more discrimination toward both americans and asians than other new zealanders both men and women whose gender identities were important to them showed more discrimination toward members of the opposite sex than members of their own sex

the authors of social identifications set out to make accessible to students of social psychology the social identity approach developed by henri tajfel john turner and their colleagues in bristol during the 1970s and 1980s michael hogg and dominic abrams give a comprehensive and readable account of social identity theory as well as setting it in the context of other approaches and perspectives in the psychology of intergroup relations they look at the way people derive their identity from the social groups to which they belong and the consequences for their feelings thoughts and behaviour of psychologically belonging to a group they go on to examine the relationship between the individual and society in the context of a discussion of discrimination stereotyping and intergroup relations conformity and social influence cohesiveness and intragroup solidarity language and ethnic group relations and collective behaviour social identifications fills a gap in the

literature available to students of social psychology the authors presentation of social identity theory in a complete and integrated form and the extensive references and suggestions for further reading they provide will make this an essential source book for social psychologists and other social scientists looking at group behaviour

this book analyses recent developments in intergroup research it diverges from classical approaches that looked at diverse needs and motives focussing not on what motivates intergroup behaviour but on how intergroup behavior functions

social identity theory posits that situational factors increase category salience that in turn brings intergroup bias such as prejudice stereotype and discrimination this study investigates the effects of two situational factors conflict and power differentials on social identity and intergroup discrimination we hypothesize that high conflict or high power differentials raise the strength of social identity and therefore result in greater intergroup discrimination result showed that intergroup power differentials had a direct effect on intergroup discrimination not mediated by social identity strength additionally different response patterns were found between male and female subjects with females showing stronger gender identity and less intergroup discrimination than males male s gender identity was stable across conditions while female showed greater variability of gender identity across conditions some implications on managing diversity were suggested
