begins only after the school community has suffered the loss of a student schools must start to be proactive and educate themselves about risk factors and prevention strategies designed as a handbook for busy educators a culture of caring a suicide prevention guide for schools k 12 includes information about prevention intervention and postvention along with commentary from experts in the field each chapter stands alone and does not have to be read in sequence resources and descriptions of programs relevant to each chapter are organized by topic school leaders counselors and teachers can use the information to create their own plans or just glance through it to get ideas with this book any school community that takes suicide prevention seriously will have access the knowledge tools and resources to save lives
