this is a revised and expanded edition of cowan and rakusan's source book for linguistics in addition to the chapters on phonetics phonology phonological alternations morphology syntax sound change and historical reconstruction there are two new chapters on semantics and grammatical and lexical change plus an index of the 93 languages and dialects represented in the book and a revised bibliography new exercises have been added to most chapters and many exercises have been revised to focus on new issues in linguistics solutions can be found in a separate section this new edition is an up to date teaching tool and a source of examples in a variety of linguistic applications

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this useful sourcebook contains 12 chapters written by experienced classroom practitioners in hong kong one theme appears constantly in these chapters that in the english language classroom whether at primary secondary or tertiary levels high interest and positive motivation occur through active learning when literary texts literary techniques and literariness are featured in this book full coverage is given to the use of poetry prose and drama in language learning and teaching at all

three levels of the education system the tasks and activities described here have been shown to work with all bands of students this book is ideally suited both for practising teachers and participants in teacher education programmes in hong kong and the rest of s e asia it will be particularly useful for primary and secondary teachers of english wishing to incorporate appropriate and relevant teaching activities so as to meet the goals of the new target oriented english language curriculum

this volume provides a critical roadmap through the major historical sources of legal semiotics as we know them today the history of legal semiotics now at least a century old has never been written a non event itself pregnant with semiotic possibility as a consequence its sources are seldom clearly exposed and as word object and meaning change are sometimes lost they reach from an english translation of the 1916 inaugural lecture of the first chair in legal significs at the amsterdam university via mid 20th century studies on property or contract to equally fascinating essays on contemporary semiotic problems produced by former students of the roberta kevelson semiotics roundtable seminar at penn state university 2012 and 2013 together the materials in this book weave the fabric of semiotics and significs two names for the unfolding of semiotics in law and legal discourse at least until the second half of the 20th century and both of which covered a lawyer s focus on sign and meaning in law the latter is embedded within the cultural imperatives of the civilization that gave these terms meaning and made them an effective tool for the dissection of law its reconstitution as an instrument to be used by the lawyer to advance the interests of her clients and for judges as a means to restructure language as a narrative of law whose power could bend behavior to its strictures legal semiotics has become an indispensable part of the elite lawyer s toolkit and a fundamental approach to analysis of legal texts two previous volumes published in 2011 and 2012 explored the conceptual methodological and epistemological progress in the field of legal semiotics the modern forms of semiotics study and the mechanics of meaning making processes by lawyers yet the great lessons of semiotics requires a focus on the origins of the concepts and frameworks that would become contemporary legal semiotics its origins as an object of the consciousness of meaning making one whose roots as lessons for the oracular conversations of law are expanded in this volume

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the empirical and descriptive strengths of sociolinguistics developed over more than 40 years of research have not been matched by an active engagement with theory yet over this time social theorising has taken important new turns linked in many ways to linguistic and discursive concerns sociolinguistics and social theory is the first book to explore the interface between sociolinguistic analysis and modern social theory the book sets out to reunite sociolinguistics with the concepts and perspectives of several of the most influential modern theorists of society and social action including bakhtin foucault habermas sacks goffman bourdieu and giddens in eleven newly commissioned chapters leading sociolinguists reappraise the theoretical framing of their research reaching out beyond conventional limits the authors propose significant new orientations to key sociolinguistic themes including social motivations for language variation and change language power and authority language and ageing language race and class language planning in substantial introductory and concluding chapters the editors and invited discussants reassess the boundaries of sociolinguistic theory and the priorities of sociolinguistic methods sociolinguistics and social theory encourages students and researchers of sociolinguistics to be more reflexively aware and critical of the social bases of their analyses and invites a reassessment of the place sociolinguistics occupies in the social sciences generally

this volume provides accurate and reliable data from 1 159 common cognates found in 19 dialects from the tai language family originally collected by noted tai linguist the late william j gedney the data are organized into the three branches of the tai language family the southwestern the central

and the northern to facilitate comparisons among the various sound systems within the individual branches and within the tai language family as a whole supplementing the cognates are phonological descriptions of each of the dialects included among the nineteen dialects are siamese white tai black tai shan lue yay saek and dialects found at leiping lungming pingsiang and ningming in china the meticulous attention paid to consonants vowels and tones found in each cognate will allow for further dialect studies for the investigation of questions concerning the tripartite division of the tai language family and for the continuing investigation into the reconstruction of the proto tai language family and its wider genetic relationships

north borneo sourcebook seeks to address the lack of available data for the languages of northern borneo where forty to fifty distinct languages are spoken in the malaysian state of sabah alone while members of the summer institute of linguistics sil have worked in sabah for several decades and have published articles on individual languages until now no comprehensive survey of the languages of sabah had yet been done in addition to the languages native to sabah also included in this monograph are closely related southwest sabah languages spoken in neighboring parts of the malaysian state of sarawak the indonesian province of kalimantan utara and brunei darussalam the author has included 594 entries with equivalents in each of the forty six languages that represent the linguistic variation in north borneo along with introductory sections listing the personal pronouns demonstrative pronouns and case markers for each language this sourcebook thus fills a critical need in surveying the languages of a single large area in an island of southeast asia many language communities in this region are endangered and likely to disappear as functioning entities within the next generation or two this book may be the only record we will ever have of their existence linguists and those with an interest in austronesian languages will appreciate the breadth and detail that illuminate the linguistic scene in an area where before there had been only pinpoints of light

this second edition of the history of the english language a sourcebook provides a comprehensive and accessible guide to the origins and development of the english language first published in 1992 the book contains over fifty illustrative passages drawn from the oldest english to the twentieth century the passages are contextualised by individual introductions and grouped into the traditional periods of old english early middle english later middle english early modern english and modern english these periods are connected by brief essays explaining the major linguistic developments associated with each period to produce a continuous outline history for this new edition professor burnley has expanded the outline of linguistic features at each of the main chronological divisions and included more selections and illustrations a new section has also been included to illustrate the language of advertising from the 18th century to the present the book will be of general interest to all those interested in the origins and development of the english language and in particular to students and teachers of the history of the english language at a level and university

provides a critical synthesis of the key ideas findings methods and approaches that make up the interdisciplinary field of sociolinguistics it includes both classic texts and contemporary state of the art research with a bias towards the latter the editors aver that the collection will stand as an articulation of the new sociolinguistics as it is emerging through a sustained reflexive reassessment of the field which is now ongoing set against a core of classic texts

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
