the major source of information on the availability of standardized tests wilson library bulletin covers commercially available standardized tests and hard to locate research instruments

the subject of this book is the analysis and processing of structural or quantitative data with emphasis on classification methods new algorithms as well as applications in various fields related to data analysis and classification the book presents the state of the art in world wide research and application of methods from the fields indicated above and consists of survey papers as well as research papers

the d2 test measures processing speed rule compliance and quality of performance allowing for a neuropsychological estimation of individual attention and concentration performance originally developed to measure driving aptitude and efficiency the d2 test has become the mainstay of attentional assessment in europe the test can be administered within 8 minutes either individually or in a group format the economy of the test expands its availability to a much larger population of neuropsychologists researchers and clinicians the reliability has proven to be very high and the validity of the technique has been documented by a number of research studies extensive norms are available based on a german sampling of over 6 000 subjects preliminary us norms for children college students and the elderly are also included research supports the multiple clinical and empirical applications of the d2 test now available for the first time with an english manual including norms and correlations this user friendly test is gaining increasing recognition in the us this test belongs in every researcher s and clinician s test repertoire especially when the assessment of attentional capabilities has to be balanced against cost effectiveness

significant new insights and research findings about brain behavior relationships neurological disorders neurodiagnostic issues and neuropsychological assessment procedures are incorporated into the third edition of neuropsychological assessment preliminary chapters present the principles necessary for a patient oriented personalized hypothesis testing approach to neuropsychological assessment the subsequent chapters contain nearly all of the tests and assessment techniques covered in the previous editions plus many additional ones including newly developed neuropsychological tests tests from other

branches of psychology research techniques that have only recently been introduced into clinical neuropsychology tests originating in Europe and elsewhere and a few measures as yet untried by neuropsychologists in a reorganization designed to meet current thinking and assessment procedures tests originally offered in prepackaged batteries are now presented within their appropriate functional domains for example individual memory tests whether developed singly or for use in a commercial battery are discussed in the chapter on memory tests while a new chapter deals with memory batteries questionnaires and inventories a separate chapter reviews prepackaged and commercial test batteries used for general purpose neuropsychological assessment but the individual tests from these batteries are treated elsewhere according to the salient functions they examine following chapters on observational measurement techniques and on measures of personality and emotional status the concluding chapter presents an array of techniques that have been used to identify motivational problems and malingering

In most discussions about intellectual development and assessment the focus is on children rarely do assessment practitioners focus on cognitive impairments and other intellectual development issues pertaining to adults on the cutting edge of assessment issues Gregory's book includes adults as his primary focus attempting to answer such important questions as when is an intellectual assessment appropriate how do professional and ethical standards inform the practice of assessment this book responds to a void in the field of assessment following the recent release of the Wechsler Adult Scale Test which is now the cornerstone for adult intellectual assessment until the publication of this book there has been no extensive information available about the effective use and interpretation of this and other important assessment tests this single volume contains comprehensive information including test norms and standards for effective use of the Wechsler Adult Scale Test and many other tests mental status attention concentration sensory perceptual psychomotor memory language drawing higher cognitive functions intelligence readers will understand the context of psychological assessment the importance of personal background and mental status in assessment and the shifting professional standards and ethics of today psychologists educators and school counselors a longwood professional book

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presents practitioners with a comprehensive guide for understanding attention deficit hyperactivity disorder a complex affliction characterized by inattention overarousal hyperactivity and impulsivity includes a comprehensive overview of the problems encountered by children as well as approaches to school intervention examines all aspects of evaluation and treatment and offers a model for assessment and a well defined set of guidelines for multidisciplinary treatment services for children with attention disorder and their families also provides a guide for the prescription and management of medications

In recent years there has been an enormous increase in interest into disorders of higher cortical functions and into brain behavior relationships the handbook of neuropsychology has been planned as a reference source that will provide for the first time comprehensive and current coverage of both experimental and clinical aspects of neuropsychology the chapter authors have produced in depth reviews that go beyond a summary of their results and points of view each chapter is up

to date covering the latest developments in methodology and theory discussion of bedside evaluations laboratory techniques as well as theoretical models are all to be found in the handbook in addition the editors have attempted to make the handbook as coherent as possible by encouraging minimal overlap in topic matter the first section introduces historical developments in neuropsychology approaches to the clinical and experimental assessment of higher cortical functions as well as statistical and methodological issues in addition the introduction covers cerebral dominance and specialization as well as models of cognition section 2 topic editor professor g rizzolatti deals with normal and disordered attentional processes in experimental animals and in humans section 3 topic editor professor h goodglass encompasses language aphasia and related disorders it is shared over volumes 1 and 2 this section emphasizes both the classical syndromes of aphasic disorders as well as the contribution of modern neurolinguistics special issues include bilingual and polyglot aphasia disorders of sign language aphasia in left handers as well as recovery and therapy of aphasia this section concludes with chapters on disorders of gestural behavior and apraxia

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
