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hundreds of anthologies of women's short stories have appeared in the literary market between the 1970s and now this publishing and cultural phenomenon is considered for the first time in this book which argues that during this period anthologies have become a literary technology used not only to make visible female short story writers but also to think about and mould ideas of womanhood through creative and contextualised readings of the most important anthologies produced in this period this study shows that this literary form has contributed to and in some cases pioneered key developments in gender theory and feminist thought including questions of political combination among women which underlie contemporary global movements such as metoo in doing so the book also develops the first book length conceptualisation of the features and meaning making mechanisms of the short story anthology as a literary form this book will benefit academics and students working in the fields of short fiction publishing and women's studies as well as feminist scholars and a growing number of specialists interested in the anthology as a literary form worldwide

this companion offers students and scholars a comprehensive introduction to the development and the diversity of the american short story as a literary form from its origins in the eighteenth century to the present day rather than define what the short story is as a genre or defend its importance in comparison with the novel this companion seeks to understand what the short story does how it moves through national space how it is always related to other genres and media and how its inherent mobility responds to the literary marketplace and resonates with key critical themes in contemporary literary studies the chapters offer authoritative introductions and reinterpretations of a literary form that has re emerged as a major force in the twenty first century public sphere dominated by the internet

this collection explores the history and development of the anglophone short story since the beginning of the nineteenth century

my plan is that this anthology become an annual compilation of aspiring oregonaeur based writers of poetry and short stories for all genders and ages this initial edition finds fortyaeur eight oregon writers from twentyaeur eight different oregon cities submitting their original offerings spanning a wide variety of genres

covering a range of topics settings and styles the book offers the first comprehensive study of short fiction from the first world war

this book considers the key critical interventions on short story writing in south africa written in english since the year 2000 the short story genre whilst often marginalised in national literary canons has been central to the trajectory of literary history in south africa in recent years the short story has undergone a significant renaissance with new collections and young writers making a significant impact on the contemporary literary scene and subgenres such as speculative fiction erotic fiction flash fiction and queer fiction expanding rapidly in popularity this book examines the role of the short story genre in reflecting or championing new developments in south african writing and the ways in which traditional boundaries and definitions of the short story in south africa have been reimagined in the present drawing together a range of critical interventions including scholarly articles interviews and personal reflective pieces the volume traces some of the aesthetic and thematic continuities and discontinuities in the genre and sheds new light on questions of literary form finally the book considers the place of the short story in twenty first century writing and interrogates the ways in which the short story form may contribute to or recast ideas of the post apartheid or

throughout this text valerie shaw addresses two key questions what are the special satisfactions afforded by reading short stories and how are these satisfactions derived from each story s literary techniques and narrative strategies she then attempts to answer these questions by drawing on stories from different periods and countries by authors who were also great novelists like henry james flaubert kafka and d h lawrence by authors who specifically dedicated themselves to the art of the short story like kipling chekhov and katherine mansfield by contemporary practitioners like angela carter and jorge luis borges and by unfairly neglected writers like sarah orne jewett and joel chandler harris

this book is a study of the short story one of the widest taught genres in english literature from an innovative methodological perspective both liminality and the short story are well researched phenomena but the combination of both is not frequent this book discusses the relevance of the concept of liminality for the short story genre and for short story cycles emphasizing theoretical perspectives methodological relevance and applicability liminality as a concept of demarcation and mediation between different processual stages spatial complexes and inner states is of obvious importance in an age of global mobility digital networking and interethnic transnationality over the last decade many symposia exhibitions art and publications have been produced which thematize liminality covering a wide range of disciplines including literary geographical psychological and ethnicity studies liminal structuring is an essential aspect of the aesthetic composition of short stories and the cultural messages they convey on account of its very brevity and episodic structure the generic liminality of the short story privileges the depiction of transitional situations and fleeting moments of crisis or decision it also addresses the moral transgressions heterotopic orders and forms of ambivalent self reflection negotiated within the short story s confines this innovative collection focuses on both the liminality of the short story and on liminality in the short story

this volume is a collection of essays on black short stories written between 1998 and 1976 it aims to say something about the black short story as a genre and the development of the racial situation in america as well the primary aim is to introduce the reader to this long neglected genre of black fiction in contrast to the black novel the short story has hardly been given extensive criticism let alone serious attention the individual essays of this collection aim at presenting new points of critical orientation in the hope of reviving and fostering further discussions they provide a variety of approaches and a great diversity of critical points of view
