guillermo del toro s frankenstein premieres on netflix november 2025 two centuries after its original publication mary shelley s classic tale of gothic horror comes to vivid life in what may very well be the best presentation of the novel to date guillermo del toro remarkably a nineteen year old writing her first novel penned a tale that combines tragedy morality social commentary and a thoughtful examination of the very nature of knowledge writes best selling author leslie s klinger in his foreword to the new annotated frankenstein despite its undeniable status as one of the most influential works of fiction ever written mary shelley s novel is often reductively dismissed as the wellspring for tacky monster films or as a cautionary tale about experimental science gone haywire now two centuries after the first publication of frankenstein klinger revives shelley s gothic masterpiece by reproducing her original text with the most lavishly illustrated and comprehensively annotated edition to date featuring over 200 illustrations and nearly 1 000 annotations this sumptuous volume recaptures shelley s early nineteenth century world with historical precision and imaginative breadth tracing the social and political roots of the author s revolutionary brand of romanticism braiding together decades of scholarship with his own keen insights klinger recounts frankenstein s indelible contributions to the realms of science fiction feminist theory and modern intellectual history not to mention film history and popular culture the result of klinger s exhaustive research is a multifaceted portrait of one of western literature s most divinely gifted prodigies a young novelist who defied her era s restrictions on female ambitions by

independently supporting herself and her children as a writer and editor born in a world of men in the midst of a political and an emerging industrial revolution shelley crafted a horror story that beyond its incisive commentary on her own milieu is widely recognized as the first work of science fiction the daughter of a pioneering feminist and an enlightenment philosopher shelley lived and wrote at the center of british romanticism the exuberant young movement that rebelled against tradition and reason and with a rebellious scream gave birth to a world of gods and monsters del toro following his best selling the new annotated h p lovecraft and the new annotated sherlock holmes klinger not only considers shelley s original 1818 text but for the first time in any annotated volume traces the effects of her significant revisions in the 1823 and 1831 editions with an afterword by renowned literary scholar anne k mellor the new annotated frankenstein celebrates the prescient genius and undying legacy of the world s first truly modern myth the new annotated frankenstein includes nearly 1 000 notes that provide information and historical context on every aspect of frankenstein and of mary shelley s life over 200 illustrations including original artwork from the 1831 edition and dozens of photographs of real world locations that appear in the novel extensive listings of films and theatrical adaptations an introduction by guillermo del toro and an afterword by anne k mellor

a monster assembled by a scientist from parts of dead bodies develops a mind of his own as he learns to loathe himself and hate his creator in an annotated edition that offers insights into shelley s literary and social worlds

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includes an introduction over 160 illustrations and detailed annotations that illuminate the literary historical social and biographical aspects of the text

manguel gives a detailed and highly sensitive account of the film s felicities of inventive film making he also traces the literary roots of the frankenstein myth the creation of a living being by a man usurping the powers of a jealous god and he finds echoes in the work of modern artists such as max ernst and marcel duchamp of the bride as a kind of femme fatale monstrous and threatening

mary shelley s 1818 novel frankenstein is its own type of monster mythos that will not die a corpus whose parts keep getting harvested to animate new artistic creations what makes this tale so adaptable and so resilient that nearly 200 years later it remains vitally relevant in a culture radically different from the one that spawned its birth monstrous progeny takes readers on a fascinating exploration of the frankenstein family tree tracing the literary and intellectual roots of shelley s novel from the sixteenth century and analyzing the evolution of the book s figures and themes into modern productions that range from children s cartoons to pornography along the way media scholar lester d friedman and historian allison b kavey examine the adaptation and evolution of victor frankenstein and his monster across different genres and in different eras in doing so they demonstrate

mary shelley began writing frankenstein when she was only eighteen at once a gothic thriller a passionate romance and a cautionary tale about the dangers of science frankenstein tells the story of committed science student victor frankenstein obsessed with discovering the cause of generation and life and bestowing animation upon lifeless matter frankenstein assembles a human being from stolen body parts but upon bringing it to life he recoils in horror at the creature's hideousness tormented by isolation and loneliness the once innocent creature turns to evil and unleashes a campaign of murderous revenge against his creator frankenstein frankenstein an instant bestseller and an important ancestor of both the horror and science fiction genres not only tells a terrifying story but also raises profound disturbing questions about the very nature of life and the place of humankind within the cosmos what does it mean to be human what responsibilities do we have to each other how far can we go in tampering with nature in our age filled with news of organ donation genetic engineering and bio terrorism these questions are more relevant than ever

frankenstein or the modern prometheus generally known as frankenstein is a novel written by the british author mary shelley the title of the novel refers to a scientist victor frankenstein who learns how to create life and creates a being in the likeness of man but larger than average and more powerful in popular culture people have tended to refer to the creature as frankenstein despite this being the name of the scientist frankenstein is a

novel infused with some elements of the gothic novel and the romantic movement it was also a warning against the over reaching of modern man and the industrial revolution alluded to in the novel s subtitle the modern prometheus the story has had an influence across literature and popular culture and spawned a complete genre of horror stories and films it is arguably considered the first fully realized science fiction novel
