within the black community emma lou morgan s skin is black so
black that it s a source of shame to her not only among the
largely white community of her hometown of boise idaho but also
among her lighter skinned family and friends seeking a community
where she will be accepted she leaves home at age eighteen
traveling first to los angeles and then to new york city where in
the harlem of the 1920s she finds a vibrant scene of nightclubs
and dance halls and parties and love affairs and still rejection
