classification by social group non specific indicators of stress observed on human skeletal remains were used to elicit information about prehistoric diet and health of 112 peruvian north coast individuals focusing on remains from the sicán archaeological project these indicators included linear enamel hypoplasia leh harris lines cribra orbitalia iron deficiency anemia porotic hyperostosis dental wear dental caries incidence of dead teeth abscesses antemortem tooth loss and measurement of stature conclusions are based on the results of over 6 000 measurements the sicán showed more variation in developmental health by social group inferred from archeological evidence than by location and or center versus rural periphery a new integrated macro and micro indicator method mmim was applied to illustrate the longitudinal nature of developmental stresses and their continuing impact upon adult health when bone macro and micro stress indicators were compared it was found that leh and both type ii and double zonal osteons co occurred most often in the samples from juvenile individuals leh was also present in all of the sicán adults with type ii and double zonal osteons these findings strongly support the premise that the processes of childhood stress which lead to disruption of enamel calcification also slow micro structural bone activity it is possible that these factors led to decreased physical activity in the affected children which could slow micro structural processes it is expected that physical anthropological studies of this type will continue to contribute to the sicán archaeological project as it pursues its distinguished long term sustained regional diachronic interdisciplinary holistic approach to the sicán culture
