idiosyncratic understanding of the social compact illuminates his differences not only with hamilton but with jefferson as well both men madison feared were too ready to resort to original principles in coming to terms with the constitution putting at risk the fragile achievement of the founding in their determination to invoke respectively the claims of the few and the many as american compact persuasively concludes madison s ideas on the origin and aims of the constitution are not just of historical interest they carry crucial lessons for our own day and speak directly to current disputes over diversity constitutional interpretation the fate of federalism and the possibilities and limits of american citizenship
