sent me this scripture describes two wills if there are two wills then there must be two beings if one sends the other then one is evidently in charge which means they cannot be the same or equal many other scriptures concur such as 1 corinthians 11 3 niv that reads the head of christ is god the book highlights the scriptures used for support of this doctrine and includes the contexts that surround those same verses to show that the bible does not teach a triune type of god anywhere this book offers over one hundred scriptures that combine to prove the falseness of the teaching of the trinity besides more than enough scriptural evidence the book also brings into focus how other bible versions render those same trinity scriptures and dives into the history of this doctrine when these things are all exposed the trinity fails to deliver as truth
