Pershing internalized ways of behaving in Indian country that shaped their approach to later colonial appointments abroad Scott's ethnographic knowledge and experience with Native Americans were valorized as an asset for colonial service Bullard and Pershing who had commanded African American troops were regarded as particularly suited for roles in the pacification and administration of colonial peoples overseas after returning to the mainland these three men played prominent roles in the punitive expedition President Woodrow Wilson sent across the southern border in 1916 during which Mexico figured as the next iteration of Indian country with rich biographical detail and ambitious historical scope prairie imperialists makes fundamental connections between American colonialism and the racial dimensions of domestic political and social life during peacetime and while at war ultimately Bjork contends the concept of Indian country has served as the guiding force of American imperial expansion and nation building for the past two and a half centuries and endures to this day
