the old patagonian express tells of paul theroux s train journey down the length of north and south america beginning on boston s subway he depicts a voyage from ice bound massachusetts to the arid plateau of argentina s most southerly tip via pretty central american towns and the ancient incan city of macchu pichu shivering and sweating by turns as the temperature and altitude rise and plummet he describes the people he encountered thrown in with the tedious and unavoidable mr thornberry in limón and reading to the legendary blind writer jorge luis borges in buenos aires witty sharply observed and beautifully written this is a richly evocative account of travelling to the end of the line

the old patagonian express better known as la trochita is a 1922 steam train that s been preserved and still runs in its original condition it travels through patagonia along 402 kilometers puffing steam from its innards while pulling a long line of cars loaded with adventures this book tells its long history how it was built describes its route in rich detail explains how a steam locomotive works covers the rolling stock takes a tour through the workshops and tells the most spectacular stories from locals and railroad workers firsthand for 7 years we traveled the entire branch line interviewing locals and railroad workers in search of the living history of this patagonian steam train one of the last in original condition remaining in the world we conducted dozens of interviews built up an image bank with more than 2 000 photos and created a traveling photo exhibition
