new york times bestseller an urgent argument that america and other democracies are in peril because they have lost the will to defend the values and institutions that sustain freedom and prosperity epic and debate shifting david brooks new york times only once in the last 250 000 years have humans stumbled upon a way to lift ourselves out of the endless cycle of poverty hunger and war that defines most of history if democracy individualism and the free market were humankind s destiny they should have appeared and taken hold a bit earlier in the evolutionary record the emergence of freedom and prosperity was nothing short of a miracle as americans we are doubly blessed because the radical ideas that made the miracle possible were written not just into the constitution but in our hearts laying the groundwork for our uniquely prosperous society those ideas are our rights come from god not from the government the government belongs to us we do not belong to it the individual is sovereign we are all captains of our own souls not bound by the circumstances of our birth the fruits of our labors belong to us in the last few decades these political virtues have been turned into vices as we are increasingly taught to view our traditions as a system of oppression exploitation and privilege the principles of liberty and the rule of law are under attack from left and right for the west to survive we must renew our sense of gratitude for what our civilization has given us and rediscover the ideals and habits of the heart that led us out of the bloody muck of the past or back to the muck we will go

we immerse ourselves daily in expressions of popular culture youtube videos hip hop music movies adverts greeting cards videogames and comics to name just a few possibilities and far too often we pay only scant critical attention to them the essays in this collection redress this situation by probing a wide range of topics within the field of popular culture studies written in engaging and jargon free prose contributions critically examine various offerings in film television social media music literature sports and related areas moreover they often pay special attention to the ways in which these pop culture artefacts intersect with issues of race ethnicity gender sexual orientation age and ability providing a rich mixture of broad perspectives and intriguing case studies the essays form a compelling mosaic of findings and viewpoints on popular culture exploring everything from toxic masculinity in twenty first century television programmes to gendered greeting cards and adult colouring books this provocative volume is essential reading for anyone interested in that fabricated and all pervasive environment we call popular culture

this book is a collaboration between a biblical scholar mary ann beavis and a practical theologian hyeran kim cragg who are concerned with the way that the

bible is portrayed and interpreted in popular culture including but not limited to the movies this concern points to a need for a conversation examining what the bible actually says in order to uncover transformations and distortions of the biblical stories in the wider culture including christian culture our conversation is counter cultural not in an oppositional way but taking an alternative posture that aims to provide different insights by drawing from and closely looking at the bible the chapters take a christian canonical approach articulating what the bible says and doesn't say with regard to culturally pervasive themes such as sin and salvation christ and antichrist heaven and hell in contrast to popular understandings as disseminated in primarily film advertising television etc we hope that together we will open up fertile academic ecclesial and secular space for disclosing loaded cultural and ideological views towards offering positive and intriguing insights embedded in the bible

in the wake of Guantanamo Bay extraordinary renditions and secret torture centres in eastern Europe and elsewhere revenge versus legality addresses the relationship between law and wild or vigilante justice between the power to enforce retribution and the desire to seek revenge taking up a variety of narratives from the eras of romanticism realism modernism and the contemporary period and including new theories to explain the interactions that occur between legalistic courtroom justice and the vigilante variety revenge versus legality analyzes some of the main obstacles to justice ranging from judicial corruption to racism and imperialism the book culminates in a consideration of that form of crime or lawlessness that poses the most serious threat to the rule of law vigilante justice masquerading as legality with its mixture of politics literature law and film this lively and accessible book offers a timely reflection on the enduring phenomenon of revenge

Inga Karetnikova's method is that of the art teacher she asks students to study great works in detail to analyze them and then to create their own she stresses that her examination is interested only in how the scripts are written and what makes them work not in a cultural or scholarly examination of them Karetnikova analyzes eight screenplays *The Godfather* *Rashomon* *La Strada* *Bicycle Thief* *Nosferatu* *The Servant* *Viridiana* *Notorious* and a novel written in screenplay form *Kiss of the Spider Woman* each serves as an example of a particular aspect of screenplay writing composing scripts developing characters constructing suspense adapting literature to cinematic space and time and weaving details and motifs within a script Karetnikova urges film students to work on their own screenplays while studying her book reading the suggested scripts and viewing the films based on them to get the most from her method she provides a series of exercises for each chapter to help

students master the skills of composing and writing film treatments developing screen stories and their characters organizing scenes and writing dialogue each of the exercises has worked successfully in her own screenplay writing classes

a comprehensive filmography listing fictional narrative films in the first volume and documentary and propaganda films in the second the films listed alphabetically were produced in many different countries the work lists films made during world war ii and after including nazi films each entry provides bibliographic information a summary of the story and a list of primary and secondary sources each volume contains a few spotlight essays partial contents
