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this companion maps the world of pop and rock pinpointing the most significant moments in its history and presenting the key issues involved in understanding popular culture s most vital art form expert writers chart the changing patterns in the production and consumption of popular music the emergence of a vast industry with a turnover of billions and the rise of global stars from elvis to public enemy nirvana to the spice girls they trace the way new technologies from the amplifier to the internet have changed the sounds and practices of pop and they analyse the way maverick entrepreneurs have given way to multimedia corporations in

particular they focus on the controversial issues concerning race and ethnicity politics gender and globalisation contains full profiles of a selection of figures from the pop and rock world

the pop rock and soul reader is a collection of readings that traces the evolution of american popular music from the 1920s to the present pulling together articles excerpts and critical commentary from scholarly journals popular magazines newspapers and biographies this volume introduces students to important social and cultural issues raised by the study of popular music chapter introductions and headnotes supply contextual background for the documents provide links among different eras and genres explain the issues raised by the documents and clarify the cultural and historical importance of the selections

pop music and rock music are often treated as separate genres but the distinction has always been blurred motti regev argues that pop rock is best understood as a single musical form defined by the use of electric and electronic instruments amplification and related techniques the history of pop rock extends from the emergence of rock n roll in the 1950s to a variety of contemporary fashions and trends rock punk soul funk techno hip hop indie metal pop and many more this book offers a highly original account of the emergence of pop rock music as a global phenomenon in which anglo american and many other national and ethnic variants interact in complex ways pop rock is analysed as a prime instance of aesthetic cosmopolitanism that is the gradual formation in late modernity of world culture as a single interconnected entity in which different social groupings around the world increasingly share common ground in their aesthetic perceptions expressive forms and cultural practices drawing on a wide array of examples this path breaking book will be of great interest to students and scholars in cultural sociology media and cultural studies as well as the study of popular music

we are in an era where developments in both technology and musical style have coalesced to produce the greatest period of change in the music industry since the invention of recorded sound globalization the internet and digital technology are now opening up possibilities for more artists to be innovative and financially successful but new music requires new ways of doing business for more artists to be better off requires new business models to replace those that dominated the 20th century integrating insights from economics management and intellectual property law the author explores the dynamics of entrepreneurship and innovation in the music industry and offers such provocative assessments as these the beatles might never have broken up if they had the kind of two tier contracts as band members and as solo artists that are common in the music industry today buddy holly would likely have avoided his tragic death in a plane crash at age 22 if his 1959 tour had been sponsored by a company like coca cola because today s corporatized tours are vastly better financed and organized than the haphazard efforts of the 1950s the economic value of albums by the likes of elvis and michael jackson has risen significantly since their deaths the ironic byproduct of the way their behavior tarnished their own brands while they were alive diana ross might never have quit the supremes if she had known that one

third of the artists in the 1960s who quit the group had charting careers of only one year thomas edison s invention of the phonograph led to the modern record industry but he is really the godfather of computer programs like garageband which have created home recording studios the collapse of the soviet union threatened the sound of rock and roll but an american entrepreneur saved the day

a guide for music compositions events forms genres groups history industry instruments language live music musicians songs musicology techniques terminology theory music video music is a human activity which involves structured and audible sounds which is used for artistic or aesthetic entertainment or ceremonial purposes the traditional or classical european aspects of music often listed are those elements given primacy in european influenced classical music melody harmony rhythm tone color timbre and form a more comprehensive list is given by stating the aspects of sound pitch timbre loudness and duration common terms used to discuss particular pieces include melody which is a succession of notes heard as some sort of unit chord which is a simultaneity of notes heard as some sort of unit chord progression which is a succession of chords simultaneity succession harmony which is the relationship between two or more pitches counterpoint which is the simultaneity and organization of different melodies and rhythm which is the organization of the durational aspects of music

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since the 1950s writing about popular music has become a staple of popular culture rolling stone vibe and the source as well as music columns in major newspapers target consumers who take their music seriously rapidly proliferating fanzines websites and internet discussion groups enable virtually anyone to engage in popular music criticism until now however no one has tackled popular music criticism as a genre of journalism with a particular history and evolution pop music and the press looks at the major publications and journalists who have shaped this criticism influencing the public s ideas about the music s significance and quality the contributors to the volume include academics and journalists several wear both hats and some are musicians as well their essays illuminate the

complex relationships of the music industry print media critical practice and rock culture and they repeatedly dispel the notion that being a journalist is the next best thing to being a rock star author note steve jones professor of communication at the university of illinois chicago among his books are cybersociety computer mediated communication and community editor and rock formation popular music technology and mass communication
