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what is cultural semantics how to define and analyze it in the lexicon of modern chinese this book outlines the development and research results of cultural semantic theory and then proposes the distinction between two types of cultural semantics at the synchronic level conceptual gap items and items with a cultural meaning it provides criteria for identifying these items by using detailed examples from theory and application finally the two types of cultural semantics are applied to the case of modern chinese the criteria proposed for determining the chinese cultural semantics apply not only to this but also to other languages therefore this book offers an operational basis for further studies of cultural semantics in academia

semantics of chinese questions is the first major study of chinese questions especially wh questions within the framework of alternative semantics it takes an interface approach to study the syntax semantics and phonology of questions and proposes a phonological scope marking strategy in chinese questions based upon experimental data it also incorporates historical linguistic data regarding the grammaticalization of sentence final particles such as ne and ma to study the formal diachronic semantics of questions primarily suitable for scholars in the field of chinese linguistics this book makes new theoretical contributions to the study of questions

as a distinctive syntactic structure in mandarin chinese the patient subject construction psc is one of the most interesting but least well understood structures in the language this book offers a comprehensive account of the history structure meaning and use of the psc unlike previous descriptions which were framed in terms of pre existing grammatical notions such as topicalization passivization and ergativization this book offers a fresh look at the psc in which its syntactic and semantic as well as its discourse functions are examined within the system of major construction types of the language as a whole the psc being low in transitivity serves primarily the function of backgrounding in discourse typologically the psc bears a resemblance to middle constructions in indo european and other languages

raising interesting questions about ways to understand congruent and divergent syntactic structures across the world's languages this book will be of interest to students of Chinese linguistics as well as language typology

the overall aim of this book is to advance a gricean theoretical framework of conventional implicature within which chinese pragmatic

markers can be accommodated it has two linked objectives firstly it sets out to advance a theory of conventional implicature conventional implicature is itself a highly controversial term understood very differently by various brands of contemporary pragmatic theory and is a pivotal concept in the debates between the gricean and neo gricean theorists on the one hand and proponents of relevance theory on the other this book offers an exemplary analysis and definition of what is involved in these current debates and it both clarifies and problematises a large range of associated issues the second objective is to offer a principled and systematic analysis of pragmatic markers in chinese markers of this sort and a range of interconnected categories including discourse particles have been the subject of intense investigation in recent years and this detailed study of chinese markers is a contribution in this area which is of substantial importance both theoretical and empirical

this book studies the syntax and semantics of numeral classifiers in mandarin and other chinese languages it explores how chinese classifiers are semantically interpreted in syntactic contexts and how semantic functions of classifiers are realized at the syntactic level the book is a contribution to formal chinese linguistics and to the understanding of grammatical properties of nominal phrases in chinese and east asian languages

multidimensional semantic theory has greatly influenced the semantic and pragmatic research of natural languages in the past few decades but chinese based research in this direction has been very scarce so far this monograph through five case studies investigates the distributional semantic and pragmatic characteristics of adverbs logical words negative words and conditional connectives focus particles pleonastic negation and classifiers in mandarin chinese it provides new data from chinese that relate to projective meaning and multidimensional semantic research and combines formal analyses with corpus linguistic and experimental methods the results show that the existing diagnostic tests are not fully applicable for chinese but need adjustments overall the work shows that multidimensional semantics is a general theory with strong explanatory and predictive power for natural language semantics and pragmatics and can provide new perspectives for old phenomena the book provides a chinese based example for this purpose and hopes to have implications for future semantic and pragmatic research on chinese other languages or dialects within china and cross linguistic comparisons

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
