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this is the most accessible work in english on the greatest mystical poet of islam providing a survey of the basic sufi and islamic doctrines concerning god and the world the role of man in the cosmos the need for religion man s ultimate becoming

the states and stations of the mystical ascent to god and the means whereby literature employs symbols to express unseen realities william chittick translates into english for the first time certain aspects of rumi s work he selects and rearranges rumi s poetry and prose in order to leave aside unnecessary complications characteristic of other english translations and to present rumi s ideas in an orderly fashion yet in his own words thorough nontechnical introductions to each chapter and selections that gradually present a greater variety of terms and images make this work easily accessible to those interested in the spirituality of any tradition

an engaging study of sufi teachings that presents the sufi way as a universal means of gaining a greater understanding of ourselves others and the world in sufi teaching the human heart is not a fanciful metaphor but an objective organ of intuition and perception it perceives all that is beautiful lovely and meaningful in life and reflects these spiritual qualities in the world for the benefit of others every human heart has the capacity and the destiny to bring that world of divine reality into this world of appearances the sufis mystics of islam have been educators of the heart for some fourteen centuries their teachings and methods are designed to help us awaken and purify the heart to learn to listen to our deepest knowing in the knowing heart kabir helminski presents the sufi way as a practical spirituality suitable for all cultures and times and offers insights that are especially valuable for our life in today s world in cultivating a knowing heart we learn to experience a new sense of self transform our relationships and enhance our creative capacities most important we learn how to meet the spiritual challenge of our time to realize our sacred humanness

baba rexheb a muslim mystic from the balkans founded the first bektashi community in america this is his life story and the story of his communities the traditional bektashi tekke in albania where he first served the displaced persons camps to which he escaped after the war the centuries old tekke in cairo where he waited and the bektashi community that he founded in michigan in 1954 and led until his passing in 1995 baba rexheb lived through the twentieth century its wars disruptions and dislocations but still at a profound level was never displaced through bektashi stories oral histories and ethnographic experience frances trix recounts the life and times of this modern sufi leader she studied with baba rexheb in his community for more than twenty years as a linguistic anthropologist she taped twelve years of their weekly

meetings in turkish albanian and arabic she draws extensively on baba s own words as well as interactions at the michigan bektashi center for a remarkable perspective on our times you come to know baba rexheb and his gentle way of teaching through example and parable poetry and humor the book also documents the history of the 700 year old bektashi order in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries in the balkans and egypt and its transposition to america it attests to the role of sufi centers in islamic community life and their interaction with people of other faiths

the sufi journey is a path of self discovery a journey into spirituality focusing on who we truly are and our connection to god this book is a collection of spontaneous talks inspiring and guiding us towards transformation on our quest to know ourselves and god

the journeys of a taymiyyan sufi explores the life and teachings of im d al d n a mad al w si d 711 1311 a little known anbal sufi master from the circle of ibn taymiyya d 728 1328 the first part of this book follows al w si s physical journey in search of spiritual guidance through a critical study of his autobiographical writings this provides unique insights into the rif iyya the sh dhiliyya and the school of ibn arab several manifestations of sufism that he encountered as he travelled from w si to baghdad alexandria and cairo part i closes with his final destination damascus where his membership of ibn taymiyya s circle and his role as a sufi teacher is closely examined the second part focuses on al w si s spiritual journey through a study of his sufi writings which convey the distinct type of traditionalist sufism that he taught in early eighth fourteenth century damascus besides providing an overview of the spiritual path unto god from beginning to end as he formulated it this reveals an exceptional interplay between sufi theory and traditionalist theology

ibn al arabi is still known as the great sheik among the surviving sufi orders born in muslim spain he has become famous in the west as the greatest mystical thinker of islamic civilization he was a great philosopher theologian and poet william chittick takes a major step toward exposing the breadth and depth of ibn al arabi s vision the book offers his view of spiritual perfection and explains his theology ontology epistemology hermeneutics and soteriology the clear language unencumbered by methodological jargon makes it accessible to those familiar with other spiritual

traditions while its scholarly precision will appeal to specialists beginning with a survey of ibn al arabi s major teachings the book gradually introduces the most important facets of his thought devoting attention to definitions of his basic terminology his teachings are illustrated with many translated passages introducing readers to fascinating byways of spiritual life that would not ordinarily be encountered in an account of a thinker s ideas ibn al arabi is allowed to describe in detail the visionary world from which his knowledge derives and to express his teachings in his own words more than 600 passages from his major work *al futuhat al makkivva* are translated here practically for the first time these alone provide twice the text of the *fusus al hikam* the exhaustive indexes make the work an invaluable reference tool for research in sufism and islamic thought in general

since its original publication in 1976 this volume has sold over 250 000 copies worldwide and has earned a place among the truly great stories of the spiritual quest feild vividly recounts his path of ecstasy despair hope fear confusion and enlightenment as he finds himself among the sufis and dervishes in turkey line drawings

this collection of articles by artists philosophers psychologists and social scientists explores the sufi tradition and its best known teacher rumi a 13th century poet jurist and philosopher setting aside the standard account of rumi as a poet of mystic love these contributors view his writings in a historical context investigating sufism s ties to islam and the teachings of the prophet mohammad and tracing rumi s influence on persian and turkish literature the reasons why sufism has transcended national boundaries and sectarian strife so successfully are also debated and several contributors recommend the sufi message of faith love and tolerance as a useful common ground for dialogue between religious groups

an unparalleled exploration of sufism as it is practised around the world describing meetings with today's enlightened teachers as well as including wonderfully inspiring translations of the great sufi masters of the past ultimately this book acts as a guide to the sufi path and offers wise insight into the meaning and purpose of life a compelling view of sufi history together with vivid personal remembrances of living mystics this is an inspiring and at the same time beautifully subtle book with light filled insights on every page saadi shakur chishti author of the sufi book of life the sufi path described in this book leads the seeker past ordinary states of consciousness towards a new experience of infinitude that is the source of the universe in this stage there is no duality or otherness but instead infinitude the original oneness from which all dualities and attributes emanate the book is at once an autobiography a didactic treatise and a literary opus full of wonderful translations of the words of earlier sufis as well as the author's own poetry it describes shaykh fadhlalla haeri's life quest to connect today's world with classical times especially through his meetings with enlightened sufis all over the globe shaykh fadhlalla haeri also addresses profound sufi teachings concerning the nature of humankind the cosmos and god using clear and simple language to address difficult doctrinal issues as only a master who has digested fully such knowledge could do the book also reveals much about the present day islamic world where despite the tragedies that are to be seen everywhere tradition and spirituality survive this is a metaphysical and spiritual guide to the sufi path that ultimately offers insight into the meaning and purpose of life

jamaican poet laureate lorna goodison searches for answers for herself and other caribbean based descendants of enslaved africans by examining and presenting different spiritualities in her poetry in the hope of providing alternatives to the psyche in need of healing after the traumatic events of the infamous transatlantic middle passage the inclusion of sufism in her poetry seems to have a dual purpose in that it offers a new creative angle and a sincere belief in its power to provide relief from personal anguish the fact that sufism is similar to jamaican based religions works in

its favor can jamaicans who are goodison s primary subject really relate to its message she does not underestimate her audience s capacity for change or their willingness to accept the ideas of sufism her role as facilitator is not a secret she is openly promoting her ideas and her belief that healing is possible this book is divided into three chapters in chapter one a brief history of slavery in the caribbean region with a focus on jamaica is presented the second chapter explicitly focuses on lorna goodison and her use of the written word to reveal her feelings about her ancestors and her own traumatic past it also defines sufism includes some examples of sufi poems and shows what aspects of sufism resonate with jamaican revivalism and rastafarianism the final chapter first makes reference to how sufi elements have been used by other writers such as alfred lord tennyson walt whitman thomas merton and doris lessing and then illustrates how contrary to these others goodison is the only one to apply sufi ideals to a caribbean context thus falling into her own creative category that of a new caribbean literary canon

a revised 25th anniversary edition of the classic work on sufism that jack kornfield called a heartfelt modern illumination of the sufi path filled with the fragrance of the ancients in sufism the mystical branch of islam presence is the quality that describes a heart filled state of mindfulness an experience of being conscious in the present moment it is only in this present moment sufi teachings reveal that we can connect with the divine and the divine can live through us kabir helminski is one of the world s most recognized teachers of sufism named one of the 500 most influential muslims in the world by georgetown university and the royal strategic studies center helminski and his teachings are touchstones for the growth in interest in sufism and his books have been translated around the world in living presence helminski lays out the basic principles of sufism and how these ideas can lead to the experience of presence in this inspiring work readers will learn how to cultivate presence in their lives through finding a balance between the outer stimuli of the world and our inner reactions to them harnessing faithfulness and gracefulness learning about the parallels between ancient spiritual wisdom and modern psychological knowledge meditation and contemplation to discover more meaning in daily life with unique clarity this book describes how presence can be developed to vastly improve our lives drawing on the work of the beloved sufi poet rumi as well as traditional material and personal

experience this book integrates the ancient wisdom of sufism with the needs of contemporary life completely revised and updated for its 25th anniversary this edition of living presence offers a wisdom that is both universal and practical

stations of the sufi path the one hundred fields sad maydan of abdullah ansari of herat is a key sufi text and the first in persian to address the stages or stations of the sufi way its author abdullah ansari 396 1006 448 1056 is considered one of the greatest and most prolific of the persian sufi scholars and his works constitute an important contribution to the intellectual history of islam his writings address both exoteric philosophy and esoteric understanding and range from qur an exegesis to devotional invocations and biographies of the sufis from literature and poetry to civil morality and ethics always emphasizing the divine law as well as the divine truth as the way toward understanding the one hundred fields was written by a spiritual teacher to serve as a sufi manual for guiding novices its clearly defined and detailed descriptions of each station make this work an esoteric masterpiece almost one thousand years old that still invites the reader on a spiritual journey of self discovery nahid angha provides the first complete annotated translation into english together with a full introduction it will be of interest to the specialist in sufism as well as to the general reader book jacket

kudsi erguner s memoir sets out to share not only the final moments of a vanished community but also to relate the encounter of traditional sufi culture with the western world he raises issues relating to the transmission of a teaching both musical and spiritual and the role of a traditional musician

the material in the nature of the sufi path consists of 70 commentaries on a book entitled sufism a short introduction by professor william c chittick many if not most of the paragraphs that comprise the 163 pages preface plus text of professor chittick s book contain problems errors misleading statements and or incorrect understandings concerning islam in general and the sufi path in particular this is both surprising and disturbing since the author is someone who apparently enjoys a considerable reputation in north america and perhaps elsewhere in the world as an expert on and scholar of the sufi mystical tradition i do not claim that what i say in this book is a definitive exhaustive incapable of being improved upon treatment of the sufi path

rather my hope is that the present book might move a person closer to the truth concerning the nature of that path than professor chittick s aforementioned introduction to sufism does and as such would represent an improvement over his work

baba rexheb founded the first community of the bektashi order in america this ethnographic biography recounts his life through lived example and through stories collected during frances trix s more than twenty years of study with the dervish
