this general introduction to the arabic language places special emphasis on the history and variation of the language

publications on arabic linguistics including several handbooks concentrating on the difference between the two types of arabic the classical standard language and the dialects kees versteegh charts the history and development of the arabic language from its earliest beginnings to the modern age the reader is given a solid grounding in the structure of the language its historical context and its use in various literary and non literary genres as well as an understanding of the role of arabic as a cultural religious and political world language key features covers all aspects of the history of arabic the arabic linguistic tradition arabic dialects sociolinguistics and arabic as a world language makes links between linguistic history and cultural history emphasises the role of contacts between arabic and other languages

landmarks in linguistic thought vol 3 is devoted to a linguistic tradition that lies outside the western mainstream namely that of the middle east the reader is introduced to the major issues and themes that have determined the development of the arabic linguistic tradition each chapter contains a short extract from a translated landmark text followed by a commentary which places the text in its social and intellectual context the chosen texts frequently offer scope for comparison with the western tradition by contrasting the two systems the western and the middle eastern this book serves to highlight the characteristics of two very different systems and thus stimulate new ideas about the history of linguistics this book presumes no prior knowledge of arabo islamic culture and arabic language and is invaluable to anyone with an interest in the history of linguistics kees versteegh is currently professor of arabic and islam at the middle east institute of the university of nijmegen the netherlands his publications include the explanation of linguistic causes 1995 ed arabic outside the arab world 1994

in this volume the author examines the origins of arabic linguistics on the basis of the earliest qur ānic commentaries 1st half of the 8th century a d the material used includes both edited texts and manuscript commentaries various chapters analyze the exegetical methods of the early commentators such as muqātil and muḥammad al kalbī and their use of grammatical terminology these data are compared with the earliest grammatical treatises such as sībawayhi and farrā the material presented here constitutes an important source of evidence for the development of linguistic thinking in islam and the origin of the grammatical schools of basra and kufa

this volume contains a selection of papers presented at the fifth conference on the foundations of arab linguistics fal v cambridge 2018 the first part of the book deals with sībawayhi s kitāb the oldest known treatise of arabic grammar after providing insights on some of its specific terminology these chapters evaluate its place as a source within the long term tradition of grammatical studies the second part of the book focuses on parallel developments in the arabic grammatical theory both in the classical and postclassical periods up to the 15th century some contributions also address the relationship between grammar and other disciplines notably philosophy and qur ānic exegesis as such this volume aims to deepen our knowledge of the development of linguistic theories in the islamic world

this book offers a comprehensive theory of arabicization in the middle east and egypt in the early period of the arab conquests it thereby draws on old arab grammarians coupled with modern research in second language acquisition

in 1997 naphtali kinberg died one of the best specialists in classical arabic and the arabic grammatical tradition his main work the index on farrā s ma ānī l qur ān which appeared in the brill series handbook of oriental studies 1996 will remain one of the most important reference tools for future research in this field in this volume the editors have collected a

number of articles in which kinberg demonstrates his ability to combine modern linguistic insights with the theories of the arab grammarians the result is a series of detailed studies on such aspects of the structure of arabic as conditional sentences adverbial clauses and the particles lākin and qad these articles have been published before sometimes in relatively inaccessible journals they are now made available in a collective volume and made accessible by an index that will facilitate using them in research on arabic linguistics this volume also contains an important study that was part of kinberg s legacy the edition and translation of a treatise on the pronunciation of the ḡād by the grammarian alī al mansūrī 12th 18th century this treatise is an important document on a hitherto neglected aspect of arabic phonetic studies it discusses the phonetic status of the sound that was regarded by the arabs themselves as the most characteristic sound of their language

this book explores the influence of translation on the arabic language with particular emphasis on the translation of english idioms by journalists working at arabic satellite tv stations using a mixed method approach quantitative and qualitative it begins from a belief that the impact of broadcast media on arabic speakers is more instant wider and farther reaching than that caused or triggered by any other branch of mass media as not all features of television appear in other media the book focuses on idioms because of the difficulties associated with translating them and also because the literature review revealed inadequacy in understanding this intriguing part of the development of the arabic language in contrast to other similar titles the book examines the possible factors causing journalists to resort to idiom literalisation including those relating to demographic characteristics the main significance of this book is that it has practical implications for its potential audience both practitioners and professional peers it provides information to enable media translators and lexicographers to become more sensitive towards the logico semantic relationships present in idiomatic expressions and to improve their application of idiomatic expressions in their translations overall the results presented here will serve to guide media translators and lexicographers choice in the usage of idioms to produce better quality translations and dictionaries this insight is important not only to translators and lexicographers but also to language teachers and students of translation pedagogically the findings of the current book will encourage translation teachers to reconsider their strategies for teaching english idioms students of translation and english language learners in general will also benefit from the results of this book

this volume contains sixteen contributions from the fourth conference on the foundations of arabic linguistics genova 2016 all having to do with the development of linguistic theory in the arabic grammatical tradition starting from sibawayhi s kitāb end of the 8th century c e and its continuing evolution in later grammarians up till the 14th century c e the scope of this volume includes the links between grammar and other disciplines such as lexicography and logic and the reception of arabic grammar in the persian and malay linguistic tradition

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
