this is the more expensive color version of this book for those who don't know in the back are 50 pieces of original artwork that look gorgeous buy this if you are one of those artists and want to show off to your family or if you simply want the best version of this book this book answers two questions how do ideas travel and how do i make my ideas travel the first question is interesting because the answer is emotions the more emotionally arousing an idea is the more talkative it makes people and the farther it gets learning the how's and why's takes us through discussions of the Beatles andy Warhol God himself Einstein ancient Greeks and a whole bunch of other bright spots in history it's a tale as old as time the second question is interesting because as creators we want our work to be seen the self fulfillment and fun of creating is a personal thing that needs no audience but at a certain point many of us would like to hear people's reactions and know that we're making impressions and maybe even a few bucks in that case the second question really becomes how do we make our creations emotionally arousing this is when the super fun begins we flex our empathy and make our imagination more vivid and our individuality more individual welcome to the second half of the book if you follow me on Instagram adviceforartists you already know my writing style this book is that style times a hundred we are getting creative full of appreciation

insight and non stop curiosity about life mixed with future looking optimism and art history references all in drum roll please plain readable language useful writing that is readable oh my god yes a breakthrough it s not indecipherably poetic or sleep inducingly academic putting wings on ideas reads like your best friend explaining things over dinner buy this book if you want to be inspired and simultaneously understand the world better after reading you ll know how to affix wings and bring into existence things you like chapters include developing the imagination empathizing with the audience creating moments and many more this is my favorite book on creativity there are other top dogs like zen in the art of writing by ray bradbury art of acting by stella adler keith haring s diary and elements of style by e b white but this book takes the cake it s all of those book s best characteristics plus more if you re familiar with them you will catch references maybe it s more accurate to say this book is an offspring of those a proud student and next generation multi disciplinary catch all that wants to instigate a renaissance among all types of creators yeah that sounds better happy reading

peter bogdanovich known primarily as a director film historian and critic has been working with professional actors all his life he started out as an actor he debuted on the stage in his sixth grade production of finian s rainbow he watched actors work he went to the theater every week from the age of thirteen and saw every important show on or off broadway for the next decade he studied acting starting at sixteen with stella adler his work with her became the foundation for all he would ever do as an actor and a director now in his new book who the hell s in it bogdanovich draws upon a lifetime of experience observation and understanding of the art to write about the actors he came to know along the way actors he admired from afar actors he worked with directed befriended among them lauren bacall humphrey bogart james cagney john cassavetes charlie chaplin montgomery clift marlene dietrich henry fonda ben gazzara audrey hepburn boris karloff dean martin marilyn monroe river phoenix sidney poitier frank sinatra and james stewart bogdanovich captures in their words and his their work their individual styles what made them who they were what gave them their appeal and why they ve continued to be america s iconic actors on lillian gish the first virgin hearth goddess of the screen a valiant and courageous symbol of fortitude and love through all distress on marlon brando he challenged himself never to be the same from picture to picture refusing to become the kind of film star the studio system had invented and thrived upon the recognizable human commodity each new film was built around the funny thing is that brando s charismatic screen persona was vividly apparent despite the multiplicity of his guises brando always remains recognizable a star actor in spite of himself jerry lewis to bogdanovich on the first laugh lewis ever got onstage i was five years old my mom and dad had a tux made i worked in the borscht circuit with them and i came out and i sang brother can you spare a dime the big hit at the time it was 1931 and i stopped the show naturally a five year old in a tuxedo is not going to stop the show and i took a bow and my foot slipped and hit one of the floodlights and it exploded

and the smoke and the sound scared me so i started to cry the audience laughed they were hysterical so i knew i had to get the rest of my laughs the rest of my life breaking sitting falling spinning john wayne to bogdanovich on the early years of wayne s career when he was working as a prop man well i ve naturally studied john ford professionally as well as loving the man ever since the first time i walked down his set as a goose herder in 1927 they needed somebody from the prop department to keep the geese from getting under a fake hill they had for mother machree at fox i d been hired because tom mix wanted a box seat for the usc football games and so they promised jobs to don williams and myself and a couple of the players they buried us over in the properties department and mr ford s need for a goose herder just seemed to fit my pistol these twenty six portraits and conversations are unsurpassed in their evocation of a certain kind of great movie star that has vanished bogdanovich s book is a celebration and a farewell

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
