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this new collection of essays contributed by scholars and former panthers is a ground breaking work that offers thought provoking and pertinent observations about the many facets of the party by placing the perspectives of participants and scholars side by side dr jones presents an insider view and initiates a vital dialogue that is absent from most historical studies

issues of race gender women's rights masculinity and sexuality continue to be debated on the national scene these subjects have also been in the forefront of american literature particularly in the last fifty years one significant trend in contemporary fiction has been the failure of the heroic masculine protagonist in hypermasculinities in the contemporary novel cormac mccarthy toni morrison and james baldwin josef benson examines key literary works of the twentieth century notably *Blood Meridian* 1985 *All the Pretty Horses* 1992 *Song of Solomon* 1977 and *Another Country* 1960 benson argues that exaggerated masculinities originated on the american frontier and have transformed into a definition of ideal masculinity embraced by many southern rural american men defined by violence racism sexism and homophobia these men concocted or perpetuated myths about african americans to justify their mistreatment and mass murder of black men after reconstruction as benson illustrates the protagonists in these texts fail to perpetuate hypermasculinities and as a result a sense of ironic heroism emerges from the narratives offering a unique and bold argument that connects the masculinities of cowboys and frontier figures with black males hypermasculinities in the contemporary novel suggests alternative possibilities for american men going forward scholars and students of american literature and culture african american literature and culture and queer and gender theory will find this book illuminating and persuasive

this book analyzes the community programs of the black panther party specifically those of the milwaukee branch with the aim of dispelling many of the existing stereotypes about the party misconceptions range from the party being labeled as bent on the violent destruction of the united states to it being an overwhelmingly sexist group this book challenges stereotypes such as these by examining the community programs of the party and by looking at the role of women in the party witt argues that the party was not an extremist group dedicated to overthrowing the government of the united states but rather an organization committed to providing essential community services for lower income and working class african american communities around the nation

in this comprehensive history of the illinois chapter of the black panther party ilbpp chicago native jakobi williams demonstrates that the city's black power movement was both a response to and an extension of the city's civil rights movement williams focuses on the life and violent death of fred hampton a charismatic leader who served as president of the naacp youth council and continued to pursue a civil rights agenda when he became chairman of the revolutionary chicago based black panther party framing the story of hampton and the ilbpp as a social and political history and using for the first time sealed secret police files in chicago and interviews conducted with often reticent former members of the ilbpp williams explores how hampton helped develop racial coalitions between the ilbpp and other local activists and organizations williams also recounts the history of the original rainbow coalition created in response to richard j daley's democratic machine to show how the panthers worked to create an antiracist anticlass coalition to fight urban renewal political corruption and police brutality

this book examines a range of visual expressions of black power across american art and popular culture from 1965 through 1972 it begins with case studies of artist groups including spiral obac and afriCobra who began questioning western aesthetic traditions and created work that honored leaders affirmed african american culture and embraced an african lineage also showcased is an oakland museum exhibition of 1968 called new perspectives in black art as a way to consider if black panther party activities in the neighborhood might have impacted local artists work the concluding chapters concentrate on the relationship between selected black panther party members and visual culture focusing on how they were covered by the mainstream press and how they self represented to promote party doctrine and agendas

this vibrant and expressive history of the black power movement captures the voices and personalities at the forefront of change philadelphia inquirer with the rallying cry of black power in 1966 a group of black activists including stokely carmichael and huey p newton turned their backs on martin luther king s pacifism and building on malcolm x s legacy pioneered a radical new approach to the fight for equality drawing on original archival research and more than sixty original oral histories peniel e joseph vividly invokes the way in which black power redefined black identity and culture and in the process redrew the landscape of american race relations in a series of character driven chapters we witness the rise of black power groups such as the student nonviolent coordinating committee and the black panthers and with them on both coasts of the country a fundamental change in the way americans understood the unfinished business of racial equality and integration waiting til the midnight hour traces the history of the black power movement that storied group of men and women who would become american icons of the struggle for racial equality a washington post book world best nonfiction book of 2006

winner of the 2018 book award from the american studies division of the national communication association ongoing interest in the turmoil of the 1960s clearly demonstrates how these social conflicts continue to affect contemporary politics in the bad sixties hollywood memories of the counterculture antiwar and black power movements kristen hoerl focuses on fictionalized portrayals of 1960s activism in popular television and film hoerl shows how hollywood has perpetuated politics deploring the detrimental consequences of the 1960s on traditional american values during the decade people collectively raised fundamental questions about the limits of democracy under capitalism but hollywood has proved dismissive if not adversarial to the role of dissent in fostering progressive social change film and television are salient resources of shared understanding for audiences born after the 1960s because movies and television programs are the most accessible visual medium for observing the decade s social movements hoerl indicates that a variety of television programs such as family ties the wonder years and law and order along with hollywood films including forrest gump have reinforced images of the bad sixties these stories portray a period in which urban riots antiwar protests sexual experimentation drug abuse and feminism led to national division and moral decay according to hoerl these messages supply distorted civics lessons about what we should value and how we might legitimately participate in our democracy these warped messages contribute to selective amnesia a term that stresses how popular media renders radical ideas and political projects null or nonexistent selective amnesia removes the spectacular events and figures that define the late 1960s from their motives and context flattening their meaning into reductive stereotypes despite popular television and film hoerl explains memory of 1960s activism still offers a potent resource for imagining how we can strive collectively to achieve social justice and equality

the movement for civil rights in america peaked in the 1950s and 1960s however a closely related struggle this time over the movement s legacy has been heatedly engaged over the past two decades how the civil rights movement is currently being remembered in american politics and culture and why it matters is the common theme of the thirteen essays in this unprecedented collection memories of the movement are being created and maintained in ways and for purposes we sometimes only vaguely perceive

laura pulido traces the roots of third world radicalism in southern california during the 1960s and 1970s in this accessible wonderfully illustrated comparative study focusing on the black panther party el centro de acción social y autonomo casa and east wind a japanese american collective she explores how these african american chicana o and japanese american groups sought to realize their ideas about race and class gender relations and multiracial alliances based on thorough research as well as extensive interviews black brown yellow and left explores the differences and similarities between these organizations the strengths and weaknesses of the third world left as a whole and the ways that differential racialization led to distinct forms of radical politics pulido provides a masterly nuanced analysis of complex political events organizations and experiences she gives special prominence to multiracial activism and includes an engaging account of where the activists are today together with a consideration of the implications for contemporary social justice organizing

this work looks at inter related post wwii case studies to analyze the ways in which different groups mostly governmental agencies and emerging activist organizations invoked the idea of community in anti poverty initiatives during the late 1950s and 1960s

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
