beginning with a look into simple models of supply and demand within health care this key text moves on to techniques of cost benefit analysis and then compares differing health care systems around the world featuring an array of case studies based on systems from around the world the book successfully bridges the divide between the insurance based system employed in the united states the publicly funded options more common in europe and canada and the mixed arrangements characteristic of most developing countries this informative textbook essential for students on the ever growing number of health economics courses internationally will also be useful in other areas such as public health studies medicine and health science

this book reconsiders the field of health economics as it is traditionally taught and practiced it critically examines economic theory as applied to the health sector and questions the prevailing belief that a competitive healthcare marketplace results in the best outcomes new information including an overview of standard microeconomic theory makes this new edition an ideal stand alone text for health economics and health policy courses expanded and thoroughly updated this edition features a new chapter on traditional microeconomic theory that includes an overview of demand supply competition monopoly and social welfare an expanded overview of the role of government added information about market competition and the implications for health policy expanded information about the demand for health insurance and health services a new chapter discussing for profit versus nonprofit organizations in healthcare including specialty hospitals and the nursing home and pharmaceutical industries a new chapter on healthcare workforce issues including the markets for physicians and nurses an update on the different ways developed countries can and have organized their healthcare systems

this text aims to provide non economists with an introduction to economics in public health it covers key economics principles such as supply and demand health care markets healthcare finance and economic evaluation

this volume reflects both the main issues confronting health economics and the state of the art in health economics a decade before the end of the twentieth century it contains a selection from almost 150 papers presented at the second world congress on health economics held at the university of zurich switzerland 10 14 september 1990 this is ten years after the last congress held in leiden the netherlands and more than 17 years after the tokyo meeting organized by the international economic association which might be called the first world congress were it not for its small size and symposium like character out of the 16 papers appearing in this book only four were invited and they were refereed like all

the others the remaining contributions are survivors of stiff competition however in spite of the large sample of papers we were able to draw from certain gaps of coverage persist in particular environmental impacts on health were designated as a field of priority interest in the call for papers to this congress yet not even half a dozen contributions were submitted which is remarkable in view of the intense interest of the public in the health effects of environmental degradation ranging from noise level to ozone concentration another specially designed field was the political economy of health dealing with the behavior of policy makers when deciding about changes in the health care systems it did not attract as many contributions as we had hoped for or expected

research in health economics has developed into a separate discipline for the last 25 years all this intense research activity has translated in the inclusion of courses of health economics mostly at graduate level however the industrial organization aspects of the health care market do not occupy a central place in those courses we propose a textbook of health economics whose distinguishing feature is the analysis of the health care market from an industrial organization perspective this textbook will provide teachers and students with a reference to study the market structure aspects of the health care sector the book is structured in three parts the first part will present the basic principles of economics it will bring all readers to the required level of knowledge to follow subsequent parts part ii will review the main concepts of health economics the third part will contain the core of the book it will present the industrial organization analysis of the health care market based on our own research

the handbook of health economics provide an up to date survey of the burgeoning literature in health economics as a relatively recent subdiscipline of economics health economics has been remarkably successful it has made or stimulated numerous contributions to various areas of the main discipline the theory of human capital the economics of insurance principal agent theory asymmetric information econometrics the theory of incomplete markets and the foundations of welfare economics among others perhaps it has had an even greater effect outside the field of economics introducing terms such as opportunity cost elasticity the margin and the production function into medical parlance indeed health economists are likely to be as heavily cited in the clinical as in the economics literature partly because of the large share of public resources that health care commands in almost every developed country health policy is often a contentious and visible issue elections have sometimes turned on issues of health policy showing the versatility of economic theory health economics and health economists have usually been part of policy debates despite the vast differences in medical care institutions across countries the publication of the first handbook of health economics marks another step in the evolution of health economics

the book is suitable for health economics options within undergraduate and postgraduate economics degrees and for use on health management nursing and medical degrees it is also appropriate for post experience courses for health professionals professor mooney one of the leading scholars in health economics introduces simple economic concepts and



shows how an understanding of them contributes to health service policy making the book's approach and coverage is strongly international and care is taken throughout to make the text easily accessible to readers with no prior knowledge of economics
