george karamanolis breaks new ground in the study of later ancient philosophy by examining the interplay of the two main schools of thought platonism and aristotelianism from the first century bc to the third century ad from the time of antiochus and for the next four centuries platonists were strongly preoccupied with the question of how aristotle s philosophy compared with the platonic model scholars have usually classified platonists into two groups the orthodox ones and the eclectics or syncretists depending on whether platonists rejected aristotle s philosophy as a whole or accepted some peripatetic doctrines karamanolis argues against this dichotomy he argues that platonists turned to aristotle only in order to discover and elucidate plato s doctrines and thus to reconstruct plato s philosophy and they did not hesitate to criticize aristotle when judging him to be at odds with plato for them aristotle was merely auxiliary to their accessing and understanding plato platonists were guided in their judgement about aristotle s proximity to or distance from plato by their own assumptions about what plato s doctrines were also crucial for their judgement were their views about which philosophical issues particularly mattered given the diversity of views rehearsed in plato s works platonists were flexible enough to decide which were plato s own doctrines the real reason behind the rejection of aristotle s testimony was not to defend the purity of plato s philosophy as

platonists sometimes argued in a rhetorical fashion aristotle s testimony was rejected rather because platonists assumed that plato s doctrines were views found in plato s work which aristotle had discarded or criticized the evaluation of aristotle s testimony on the part of the platonists also depends on their interpretation of aristotle himself this is particularly clear in the case of porphyry with whom the ancient discussion reaches a conclusion which most later platonists accepted while essentially in agreement with plotinus s interpretation of plato porphyry interpreted aristotle in such a way that the latter appeared to agree essentially with plato on all significant philosophical questions a view which was dominant until the renaissance karamanolis argues that porphyry s view of aristotle s philosophy guided him to become the first platonist to write commentaries on aristotle s works plato and aristotle in agreement offers much food for thought to ancient philosophers and classicists

the purpose of this study is to determine aristotle s attitude toward the content and method of plato s natural science plato and aristotle have often been regarded as on opposite sides of a philosophic great divide on the other hand those who have found that the two men were in agreement have sometimes mentioned only scattered instances of that agreement there is need for a new comparison of the two philosopher one which is limited in scope based on the primary texts and which is systematic and thorough in method if successful such a comparison would bring into sharp focus one phase of aristotle s comments on plato our attempt to meet this need is aristotle s criticism of plato s timaeus in pursuing this study it has been necessary to reject a number of uncritically accepted interpretations of the timaeus contrary to the view of many we have concluded that aristotle largely agreed with plato both in the principles and presuppositions of his natural science a number of implications stem from this study there is for example the oft questioned manner in which aristotle treated plato s philosophy in the great majority of instances aristotle stands forth as a reliable reporter and a skilled critic moreover the study sheds light on that ancient riddle whether plato and aristotle are basically akin or at odds in their general philosophies
